Healthy Church Initiative Next Steps

HCI Prescriptions

We desire transformation for our church. We want to be the church that God wants us to be. We are seeking a rejuvenation of our congregation, with a future of growth and reaching new people for Jesus. We are willing to surrender all that we do as a gift to Jesus. Because of that, we have sought out the Healthy Church Initiative (HCI) journey.

After praying, gathering information, and discerning together for months, our church voted at the end of June to accept the prescriptions of the HCI consultation team. Accepting the prescriptions means that we are assigned two coaches by the United Methodist Conference of MN to help guide our next two years, as well as having access to other specialized coaches for specific ministry transitions named in our prescriptions. Our goal is to be a vital congregation with renewed passion, a hunger for God, that engages new people, and that makes disciples for Jesus in new ways.

The prescription targets five areas:

- 1. Jubilee: Take a Sabbath year and stop doing the regular ministries, teams, and projects we normally do as a church. Also, it includes cleaning out our church building. The desire is to make capacity to discern and do God's specific work planned for us.
- 2. Simple, soulful worship. Invest in a worship service that is intergenerational and that grows our spiritual passion. This would mean a redesign of our worship so it engages all ages.

Initial Steps

The Rev. Jim Haun and Rev. Becky Jo Messenbrink will serve as our HCI coaches for the year ahead. They met with our church's HCI Leadership and Prayer teams to launch our initial steps. This includes current MLT members (Ministry Leadership Team, our current senior church leaders), staff, and other church leaders who have been involved in our HCI process.

We identified "low hanging fruit" (things that we can do easily to make a large difference) and possible conflicts and roadblocks as we begin to move into alignment with our five prescriptions (above).

We will meet again on Thurs., August 17 from 6-9 p.m. Before we meet, we are breaking down into five small task forces. Each task force is asked to meet once before the August meeting and is assigned one of the five prescriptions (above). The task force will brainstorm together ideas and ways that our congregation can live into the assigned prescription.

All of the teams will bring their ideas to the August 17 meeting, and compile an initial roadmap of what our congregation will do in the year ahead. Also at that August 17 meeting, we will form two other teams that will serve as our ongoing teams.

One is our Management Team, which will replace all the administrative teams that currently oversee our church (Resource, Finance, Trustees, LLMT, Staff-Parish, and other teams that handle regular activities). It will be made up of nine people, and meet monthly. This team will handle the daily operations of our church and work closely with staff for the ongoing life of our church.

The other team is the Implementation Action Team. This team will be about twelve people and will meet monthly or more as needed. Their job will be to receive the recommendations provided by the task forces on August 17 and work through the implementation of all the prescriptions during the year. This will mean taking a closer look at each program and ministry our church does now and assessing how we can: take a break from it for a season, make good changes to it, or continue to do it well. This process will take some time, but we hope the recommendations for our ministries will be done by our church's 50th anniversary, Sunday, December 10. Some of these we will need to do sooner rather than later, such as the worship service, the Wednesday programming, and the fall small group session. We hope to be implementing initial changes for these programs as the school year begins.

How Can You Serve?

Those who have been serving on the HCI Leadership and Prayer teams are being asked to continue to serve on this HCI planning process. MLT has been compiling people we sense may have gifts and willingness to serve. We are also seeking anyone who may feel God's prompting to get involved to come to the August 17th meeting. We need people to serve on both of the ongoing teams.

We are also asking the HCI Prayer Team to continue, and to continue to lead us in prayer and call us to prayer during this year of Jubilee. We are asking everyone to join the daily prayer prompts (simply contact the office) and continue in prayer for our church's future.

Long Range Plans

The intent of the HCI prescriptions is to create capacity for us to discern who God is calling us to be as a church. The Jubilee Sabbath will help us sit with Jesus so that we can hear and see what He is trying to show us.

A year from now, we expect to have a plan! We don't know what that is just yet, but we know there will be a plan! We expect major changes, changes that will be lasting and long-term. We won't simply be returning to doing what we've been doing. It'll be different. We will still Love. Grow. and Serve. We will worship together, have spiritual nurturing for all ages, and we will reach out into our communities and world as the visible love of Jesus. We will make disciples for Jesus. But HOW we do that will be different. And

What We Need to Do Now

So, right now, I ask for us all to seek what God's will is for us. Pray. Pray for the teams that are forming. Pray for our coaches. Pray for our leaders. Pray for the changes to our regular teams, to worship, to Wednesdays, to our small groups. Surrender our church to God, being willing for it to be however God wants it to be. Commit to being involved: Sunday morning worship (if you're in town on Sunday, commit to being in worship!), Wednesday fellowship (schedule to eat and connect at church Wednesday evenings), and small groups (prepare to join one of the church-wide studies starting in September). Commit to using the time you would normally spend on other church activities to somehow serving and connecting with people in your family, neighborhood, work, and play. Expect transformation. Expect rejuvenation. Expect change. And constantly ask God, "What is your will for our church?"


