# From the **Pastor's Perspective**

#### Being a Healthy Church

This past Saturday nine leaders from our church attended the first Healthy Church Initiative seminar. This initiative is a journey that select congregations are invited to take in order to guide them into their next chapter of being a healthy and vital church. This will be a three-year process that includes lots of training, research, collaborative discernment, and prayer! It strikes to our core desire to be the church that God calls us to be, in our current time and place. Healthy churches are vibrant and relevant. At the seminar we learned that the first part of our journey is a deep analysis of: who we are as a local church, our context (community) and the vision we discern from God. As we do this, the Conference leaders are providing us with the scope of what healthy churches look like. Here's a summary for what it means to be a healthy church:

Our mission, as United Methodists express it, is "to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world." We at Forest Hills say it this way, "We are a church that seeks to reach people for Christ and make disciples by being the visible love of Jesus Christ in our communities."

How we do this–live out this mission–is grounded on three core understandings: 1) What we do, 2) Why we do it, and 3) How we do it.

1) What we do: What we do to live out our mission. This comes from our core identity (church do what they are!). The three Scriptural Imperatives identified by our Conference as pathways to accomplish are to A. Reach New People (The Great Commission, Matt. 28:16-20), B. Grow in love of God and neighbor (The Great Commission, Matt. 22:36-40), and C. Heal a broken world (Serving our neighbor as Jesus, Matt. 25:31-46). At Forest Hills we use the words: Love, Grow, and Serve to mark these three key imperatives.

2) Why we do it: Our vision (the fuel that gives energy to the mission). This comes in the alignment of our context (who we are by), our strengths/assets (what we have), and our God-given passion (what we are good at). Where these three intersect, this is our "sweet spot" - our unique calling in our time and place. Put ...continued on page 2

another way, it's the difference we're here to make, and for whom.

3) How we do it: Our practices/activities. These are "the delivery systems" that we are busy doing as a congregation. These include radical hospitality, intentional faith formation, risk taking service and mission, extravagant generosity, passionate worship, empowered leadership, and effective governance.

Andrew and I were talking about this journey we have started as a church. It is a lot of work to do the deep analysis that we will need to do. But we agreed it is worth it. It is something we *want* to do. It is energizing, because it keeps us focused on who we as a church are supposed to be, and what we are supposed to be doing. As church leaders, this is what we "signed up for" in the first place! This is why we fell in love with the church, and why we want to devote our careers to it. We believe in the church, being this kind of church.

I hope you get impassioned about this as well. We are doing so many things well. I'm excited that this journey will help us to really focus on our "sweet spot" as a church. Let's join together and move forward!

Hang on...it's going to be a fantastic adventure!

#### Ephesians 3:14-19

"For this reason I bow my knees to the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, from whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named, that He would grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened with might through His Spirit in the inner man, that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith; that you, being rooted and grounded in love, may be able to comprehend with all the saints what is the width and length and depth and height—to know the love of Christ which passes knowledge; that you may be filled with all the fullness of God."

As we continue to progress into fall, I wanted to take a moment to discuss a new song that we will be introducing to Forest Hills. Though it has been some years since its initial release, "Forever Reign" is a song that has endured and stood above many others. When it comes to worship songs, I am really only interested in the lyrics. Ideally, a song should have a good melody and be easy enough to sing, but if it comes up short lyrically, then we would be better off singing something else.

"Forever Reign" takes us on a journey of God's attributes: You are good, You are love, You are life, You are hope, etc. It is such a benefit for us as the gathered people of God to lift up together the truth of God's unmatched quality. But the song goes on to bring us into the equation. "You are good/when there's nothing good in me ... You are true/even in my wandering ... ." This is an apt description of what it means to know the width and length and depth and height of Christ's love.

And our response? Well, that's in the bridge: "My heart will sing/no other name ... Jesus." I will admit, it sounds a bit tasteless to simply read on paper, but if we think through and apply such a focused and fervent sentiment, we will find two things to be true:

1.) Our hearts are so often not fixated on Christ. We live like children in a toy store; always jumping from aisle to aisle unable to assign real value to anything. We want it all, but only because we are so infatuated in the moment. To stop and to sing only the name of Jesus is to let the flashing lights and glitter fade away, and ascribe to him the value to which he is worthy.

2.) We can be content. Knowing the riches of God's love allows us to live free from a constant desire for more. We find peace and gratitude when we sing no other name.

Christ is our end-all-be-all. Everything else is distraction. Sure, we have to attend to mundane matters and daily responsibilities, but life is all about learning how to accomplish these while still keeping the refrain of Christ within us.
