SAMPLE COVENANTS

Small Groups are groups of *people*, and people come in all sorts of shapes and sizes. Every person is "fearfully and wonderfully made" in the *imago Dei* (image of God) and brings to a Small Group a valuable set of perspectives, experiences and wisdom all wrapped up in a unique personality. As a result, no two Small Groups are alike. Each group has its own dynamic character, reflecting the sum of its parts.

Yet within that diversity, there is a common core for Christian Small Groups – Jesus Christ. It is in Jesus' name that our Small Groups gather, whether the group's purpose is to explore faith, grow faith or both. With that common core as the anchor, a Small Group is better able to know why it exists and consider for what purpose it is meeting.

Small Group Covenants are a valuable way to help groups affirm (and subsequently, remember) their common core. The exercise of creating a Small Group covenant requires members to consciously and deliberately commit to growing with one another in Christian fellowship. This includes not only an overt acknowledgement and clarification around a group's purpose but it also provides common language that members can use to keep a group healthy and focused.

On the following pages, there are eight different sample covenants. Our hope is that within these pages, every Small Group will be able to find ideas that will spark meaningful discussion and lead Small Groups toward greater clarity in their purpose and common core of Christian faith.

DEVELOPING A SMALL GROUP COVENANT

A covenant is basically just a set of statements, agreed upon by the members, that spells out the group's purpose and operating procedures. By talking trough commitments, you can prevent problems that can damage the group later on.

Take about 15-30 minutes at the first meeting, again after 6-8 weeks, and once or twice a year thereafter, to discuss and agree upon your responses to the following topics.

Our Small Group Covenant

1) The covenant of Affirmation

I will love you and affirm you no matter what you have said or done. I love you as you are and for what Christ wants to make of you.

2) The covenant of Availability

Anything I have -- time, energy, wisdom, myself, finances -- are all at your disposal. I give these to you and the covenant group in a unique way.

3) The covenant of Regularity

I covenant to give a regular part of my time to this group when it decides to meet. I consider that time to be of highest priority on my schedule.

4) The covenant of Prayer

I promise to pray for you, to uphold you, and to attempt to be sensitive to the Holy Spirit concerning your needs.

5) The covenant of Openness

I will show myself to you, letting you know who I am as a person in feeling, history, hopes and hurts. In other words, I will need you!

6) The covenant of Honesty

I will be honest in my mirroring back to you what I sense and feel coming from you.

7) The covenant of Confidentiality

What goes on in this group stays here. I will say nothing that may be traced back or that could be injurious or embarrassing to my covenant partners.

8) The covenant of Accountability

You have a right to expect growth from me so that I may give you the fullness of the gifts which God has bestowed upon me and fulfill my God-created designs. Therefore, I will not languish in the process of growth.

Small Group Covenant

- to pray regularly for group members

Guidelines for Group Prayer

- Be prepared to share how we can support you in prayer
- Keep sharing brief and personal. More sharing about your requests can go on before or after class.
- Feel free not to pray out loud, if you do not feel comfortable.
- Pray for one another during the week!

Our prayer is that your small group is a safe place for you to be yourself, wrestle with questions regarding your faith and to be supported and encouraged in your walk with God.
