Summer Vines

I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, then you will produce much fruit. Without me, you can't do anything." -John 15:5

This July marks the beginning of the third year on our HCI (Healthy Church Initiative) journey. Our first year was full of exploring, self-study, and honesty. It culminated last June in an overwhelming vote by our Church Conference to accept the five recommendations of our HCI plan. The plan is an attempt to turn the church in a new direction—yet unseen—rather than just keep on doing what we have always done.

The first recommendation was to pause what we normally do: to simplify our programming, our building, and our calendars. We chose to spend a season "sitting at the feet of Jesus," reconnecting to our primary love. The next three recommendations were to focus on three things we would do while we paused: simple, soulful worship (kids included), fellowship Wednesdays for all ages, and three cycles of church-wide small groups. This pausing and three-fold focus filled our second year.

We begin the third year, and as we do, we begin to fulfill our fifth recommendation: to dream a new dream for our church. Our staff and AMT leadership have already started to dream, as we ask God how we are to be the church He wants us to be. We anticipate that God will transform us in some pretty different and amazing ways. We are excited! Staff and AMT went on a Leadership Retreat in the middle of June. Here are some of the beginnings of the dreaming so far.

Pastor's Perspective Cont'd

We used Jesus' teaching of the Vine and Branches (John 15:1-17) as the foundation of our retreat. We saw three major points that not only aligned with our church's mission, but shaped our visioning for the future.

1. Love: Our priority is to point people to Jesus. (It's all about Jesus!) Jesus says He is the vine, and we are the branches. It all comes from the Vine! Key "vision starters" are that all we do must be in offer to Jesus, that to do that we each need to have a personal passion and focus on Jesus, and that our strategy is to always help people take the next step closer to or with Jesus.

2. Grow: Our priority is to help people grow in spiritual maturity. (It's all about us!) Jesus says the branches (we) are to *remain* in Him. Key "vision starters" are that together we grow spiritually much better, that how we love each other in the church is part of our witness for Jesus to others, and our church community is a foretaste of the glory to come.

3. Serve: Our priority is to make Jesus' love visible to others. (It's about them!) Jesus says the branches must bear fruit. Key "vision starters" are that we must reach out to those outside of our church and create a personal relationship with those who are not here yet, that since fruit always contains seeds, so our fruit of service must plant the seed of faith in others, and we must serve the whole person and not just physical needs or in just a transactional way.

These three points form our guidelines for all our ministry in the future. Everything we do must do each of these three, and all of these three! Making disciples in the local family system will be our primary focus, and we will do this by being a church *of* small groups (not a church *with* small groups).

These are our first steps in dreaming. But we dream *together* as a church. So, what is everyone—what are *you*—hearing God say? Be sure to use the Dreambox in the lobby to share what God is showing you for our church's future. Together we dream God's new dream!

Without Jesus we can do nothing. So, church, make a point this summer to stay connected to the Vine. Attend worship when you are in town on Sundays. Join the small group on prayer later this month. And keep praying every day for our church!

God has a dream for our church! During this Jubilee year, we have committed to pause and listen. We want to sit with Jesus and hear His dreams for us. This summer we are intentionally dreaming a new dream (hearing God's dream) for our church!

AMT Update

On June 15 and 16 the Action Ministry Team had their first overnight retreat. The purpose was to have uninterrupted time as a group and move forward with the "dreaming" phase of our HCI (Healthy Church Initiative) journey, while outside of the walls of our church building. On Friday evening we began with the question, "Why did each of us keep coming back to this church family?" The answers were varied but they continually came back to biblically based sermons, being spiritually fed (small groups), authentic welcoming people, feels like home, there is a family connection.

Pastor David connected our "Love. Grow. Serve." goals with the story of the vine and the branches from John 15: 1-7. We need pruning to produce more fruit. Growth requires tending, effort, both personal growth and growth as a church.

Much of our time was spent in prayer, talking to God and listening to Him, as a large group, small group and individually.

How is our church different from any secular group that does good? The answer is Jesus. Our dream must be about Jesus. Dreams included: growth in personal relationship with God, walking away from worship feeling filled with the Holy Spirit and wanting to come back, focus on relationships, culture of family discipleship, full small groups that are meeting the needs of people where they are at, lay down what's good and find what's best. These ideas really led to wanting to be a "church of small groups, not a church with small groups".

AMT does not plan on changing our existing mission statement or our three goals of Love, Grow, Serve. We decided that ministry activities should meet all three goals. We are keeping the long held values of the church, but need to make sure we are meeting spiritual needs as well as relationship needs.

Paradigm shift-Christ centered with focus on making disciples by meeting spiritual needs of church family, community and the world.

Comments from the group at the end of the weekend included: unity as a team in the direction we need to go, joy to work with people in love with Jesus that want to help shape the direction of our church, good to get started on the dreaming portion of HCI, God's spirit was truly present, the diversity of the group is a strength.

We made more progress in 1 and ½ days than we could have done 2 hours a month. There was a breakthrough in the unity of our team. We are now moving forward with a common goal.

Please pray for our group as we continue the forward progress of God's dream for our church. This was only the beginning, we have much more work to do to expand the ideas our group felt God was leading us to.

Worship is a strange word.

It is used as both a noun and a verb and can even be used to describe a type of service or team: I *worship* (verb) while I am leading *worship* (noun) on the *worship* (adjective) team. See what I mean? It can be a little convoluted. In spite of these uses, the most important is the first: I worship.

For the Christian, worship cannot be a choice. It is not just singing songs, it is not an emotional trip, it is not a production. Worship begins with your heart. To stand before God, praising Jesus Christ and opening yourself up to the working of the Holy Spirit is the what a worshipper is all about. In the service itself, staff do their best to say the right words, sing the right notes and minimize the things that might distract, but the heart of worship beats inside each of us and we are responsible for our own experience.

We can worship with the largest choir or an off-key soloist; the most talented band or those who are just learning.

As worship leader, my job is to put together a team that will offer it's very best to God as we lead in worship. We seek to do this every week through Sanctify. As you may have noticed, we have lost two of our long-time musicians. Our bass player, Perry Ostlund, has become overstretched with a new schedule and Chris Murphy our guitarist has been experiencing pain from carpel tunnel in his hands. Please pray for them both as we ask God's blessing on them in the coming weeks.

In the meantime, Sanctify has tried to adapt to these changes. As we move into summer dreaming a new dream, we look to God to fill our ranks and bless us with leaders who have a heart for worship!

Though it might be a strange word, worship is the lifeblood of our walk with God. I need worship because my natural tendency is toward self-reliance and stubborn independence."
