Dreaming a New Dream

"In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy. Your young will see visions. Your elders will dream dreams." -Acts 2:17 and Joel 2:28

We are dreaming dreams! As a church, we are listening for the dream that God has for our future. We want to be the church that God intends for us to be. And to do that, we are dreaming a new dream.

We expect the new dream to be consistent with our former dreams. We continue as a 50-year-old church, and we affirm that God has invested in us our personality, spiritual gifts, and a legacy that we must continue. We must engage new people in relevant ways, ways that effectively make and grow disciples of Jesus.

Pastor's Perspective Cont'd

We have had a season of pause, and we will not simply go back to doing what we have done in the past. We are now in the season of dreaming, and our first phases of new ministry will begin this fall.

The most important part of dreaming is prayer. It is engaging God through Scripture and prayer, and LISTENING! So, our summer message series is on prayer - "Transformed: Praying in a Way that Changes You." We started church-wide small groups on praying for transformation. We have set up a Dreambox to collect the dreams that you are hearing from God. Please take a moment to share yours in the Dreambox in the church lobby.

We are asking the entire church to pray every day using the "Pocket Prayer." Insert your specific prayers for our church in this simple prayer structure:

Father,

You are good. - Pray ways that you see God is good.

I need your help. - Pray help for our church, for new dreams!

So do they. - Pray that our church would focus on those who do not know Jesus.

Thank you. - Thank God for the blessings of our church and how He has led us.

Amen."

As we come off of our pause, we have discerned we need a church focus on making and growing disciples. We will begin this fall with our ministry to children and youth. Our first big innovation, therefore, is that we are seeking to change our programs with children and youth. We are designing programs that engage the whole family as well as the adults of our congregation. Wednesday evenings will be a time of Christian instruction for children, but it will also be a time of equipping parents and other adults to make disciples of the next generations. Therefore, the Wednesday evening program will be

for all ages, and for everyone! See Pastor Andrew's article for a better description.

Small groups will start up in a bigger way in October, as we will offer a variety of groups, topics, and ways to grow as Christian disciples. Please suggest your recommendations for group topics to the church office or Pastor David.

The focus of our Christian discipleship will be Sundays and Wednesdays. Worship and small groups will be on Sundays. On Wednesdays, we will offer a weekly meal, our children's program (for kids, parents, and all adults), confirmation, youth group, and small groups. There will also be some small groups offered at other times during the week.

We are working hard to dream God's dream for our church. This fall we are making our priority to make and grow disciples for Jesus. This is the "grow" part of our church vision. Later this summer, our church leadership will begin visioning the "serve" part of our church vision. Stay tuned to see how our outreach and acts of mercy will be re-visioned!

Commit to growing as a disciple. And commit to grow disciples. That means using what we do together as a church family to keep yourself growing, and to help others to grow. And by others we intentionally include the next generations and those who do not yet know Jesus.

One more time: please keep praying that we will dream God's dream!

Dreambox

God has a dream for our church! During this Jubilee year, we have committed to pause and listen. We want to sit with Jesus and hear His dreams for us. This summer we are intentionally dreaming a new dream (hearing God's dream) for our church!

We want to "capture" your dream. "Upload" what you hear the Holy Spirit saying to you about our church in the Dreambox (notice the wordplay on Dropbox?) in the lobby. We want to be dreaming together as a church. So, please fill out a dreamcard and put it in the Dreambox. Dreamcards will be available ALL SUMMER in the church lobby, in Sunday bulletins, in the church office, on the church website, and in the weekly emails. We want to collect all of our dreaming, because we believe that when they are all put together, we will discern the dream that God has for our church.



This summer we are connecting, building relationships, and getting to know each other better through monthly potlucks after worship on the first Sunday of the month. This Sunday, August 5th, will be our August potluck. We ask those who remember to bring a large dish to share, so we can then tell everyone to stay and eat even if they have not brought food. Plan to stay, and encourage others to stay as well. Let's keep building community this summer!



Confirmation Starting in the Fall!

This school year we will begin a new Confirmation Class. Confirmation is open to any young person whose family is not a member of another local church. The families need not be members of Forest Hills United Methodist Church. Confirmation is open to any young person who is at least twelve years of age and younger than eighteen, and who is not already confirmed. This confirmation curriculum targets 7th - 9th graders.

The purpose of confirmation is to prepare young people to confirm for themselves the vows to receive Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Savior, which may have been made on their behalf by their parents or guardians when they were baptized as infants. To prepare young people to do this, the class of confirmation will provide a basic and fundamental understanding of the Christian faith.

If you know of a student or family that may be interested in Confirmation, please talk to Pastor David.

AMT (Action Ministry Team) Update

August of last year we made some changes to our Sunday morning worship. We also made the decision to pause "kids church" and have them join us during worship. With staff recommendation, AMT has decided to continue having an intergenerational worship experience on Sunday mornings. You will be glad to know that staff has been working on new fall programming for our children. This programming will be featured starting Wednesday September 12 and will involve the whole family.

Wednesdays will be an energetic evening starting with our community meal (please invite friends and neighbors) and our new family style program. During the month of September we will be promoting and getting people signed up for our new small groups that will begin in October.

AMT will not be evaluating current ministries at this time; however, we want all ministries to seriously take time to dream about a new future for the group. How do you reach new people coming to our church? What changes could be made to integrate young people into the group? How should the 3 requirements of Love, Grow, and Serve be a part of the ministry? Can we push ourselves out of our comfort zone and dream a new dream? Once new programming and small groups have begun, we will put together a plan for evaluation. As part of the Healthy Church Initiative (HCI) recommendations, we were also charged with decluttering our church building and refreshing our fellowship hall. The decluttering is not yet complete; however, a great start was made last fall and we will continue to ask the whole church to work on this.

In talking about refreshing the fellowship hall space, the AMT leadership team decided to go big. We plan to change the vision of the project. Instead of just refreshing, we want to "sunset" the old look. The space needs to impact and highlight our ministry. Instead of a fellowship hall, we want to transform the space into an Event Center. We want to focus on the purpose of this area, rather than just upgrading a few things. To that end, there has been a task force group created to come up with a concept to present to the church body by Sunday September 9th. This will be a culture-changing project that will continue to move everyone in our church family in the same direction. The design changes will include different wall surfaces, sound-dampening ceiling panels, and removing the bulk head by the window.

So, look for exciting changes to come in the near future! We continue to ask for prayers as AMT moves our church into a new dream for the future.

KID'S CORNER

Have you ever heard the phrase, "Faith is better caught than taught"? It's a modern version of St. Francis' dictum, "Preach the Gospel and if necessary, use words." These phrases highlight the importance of living out our faith and being an example to those among us. Might I suggest however, that Paul trumps these pithy sayings when he writes, "Faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God" (Romans 10:17). God's Word, the Gospel, must be spoken, preached, proclaimed, AND lived out accordingly. A disciple follows Jesus, speaks the Gospel and informs others about it. This is how new disciples are made. We are the church and we are here to make disciples!

Here is how we are going to do make disciples in our kid's ministries:

We begin by acknowledging that we are entrenched in a spiritual battle. Paul again: "Our struggle is not against flesh and blood but... against the forces of evil in the heavenly realms" (Eph. 6:12). It is time to suit up! It's time to train ourselves and our children to fight! Satan is a lion out to devour (1 Peter 5:8) the hearts and minds of our kids and his job is easier now than it has even been. Our Western culture has become increasingly hostile to Christianity and its claim to truth. Our kids grow up and move out only to become fresh meat in the workplace or on campus. Over and over, they fall prey to competing worldviews and twisted truths. Why? Because we have left discipleship in the realm of optional. It is time to fight this battle on behalf of our kids, to "raise them up in the way they should go" (Psalm 22:6).

Here is the kicker: I cannot do this job. The best children's program with the biggest budget and the greatest volunteers cannot do this job. God has ordained the family to be the context in which discipleship really happens. Parents have the greatest influence on the lives of their children. We cannot simply hope that our kids will become believers. Disciples are made, they are not born. If you are a parent, if you want to see your children follow after Christ, if you want faith to inform their decisions, then I want to encourage you, resource you, and help you make discipleship a reality in your home. This is a job I can do! Together, we can become disciples as we tackle the task of discipling our own family!

Wednesday nights are going to be a bit of a paradigm shift. We are looking to do something brand-new, something that may be uncomfortable and not so easy. We will still have a normal meal together beginning at 5:30, then from 6:15-7:15 we will focus on family discipleship. This means any and all kids are invited, any and all parents are invited, anyone with kids in their lives; be they grandchildren, neighbor kids, or even kids who live afar. Wednesday night will provide content and engaging activities for kids of all ages, but parents will learn as well. We want to equip parents to do family devotions at home, to be ready to tackle spiritual conversations and to be well-equipped for the spiritual battle that is already in motion.

We need to set our priorities. When it comes to our kids, do we value successful careers, involvement in sporting events, and popularity? Or is our deepest desire for them to know and love their Savior, Jesus Christ? Both can happen, but one must be primary. "As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord" (Joshua 24:15).
