Declare! A Voice Crying Out!

*"A voice is crying out: Clear the LORD's way in the desert!
Make a level highway in the wilderness for our God!"
-Isaiah 40:3*

We need Christmas!
I'm not talking about the holiday, the celebrations, the festivities. They are fun and a welcome diversion for sure. Pastor's Perspective Cont'd

John the Baptist is a crucial, but often overlooked, figure of Christmas. Deep in the Old Testament God has the prophets proclaim that one day the Messiah will come. So, to get ready, a voice will cry out: declaring to clear a way in the desert, to make ready for the coming of God, to make a pathway in the wilderness for God's arrival. It's a voice to get ready.

Then, hundreds of years later, a woman and man in Israel conceive a miracle baby. This baby boy is named John, and God says he is a voice crying out, declaring the coming of the Messiah. Before John is born, the virgin Mary (who is also pregnant) visits John's pregnant mother. When she does, John leaps in his mother's womb. Mary carries the Messiah! Thirty years later, John is baptizing in the desert near Jerusalem, telling people to repent and get ready for God's coming. Then, Jesus comes to him to be baptized, and John declares, "Behold, this is the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1:29) This begins Jesus' public ministry as the Messiah.

Today, it is we Jesus-followers who carry on proclaiming the arrival of the Messiah. Again, this Christmas it is our voice that cries out: The Messiah has come! Turn to God! Worship Jesus! This month, we will be listening to John the Baptist so we can learn to declare his message for our world today. Our Sunday message series is "John the Baptist: Declare! Be a voice crying out." We will declare: 1) Prepare!, 2) Repent!, 3) Believe!, 4) Look!, 5) Be Baptized!, and 6) I'm not worthy! We need Christmas. We need to hear this message. Our world needs to hear this message. God has come. He has brought hope. Declare!

Hearing Loop System in the Sanctuary



Thanks to two separate special gifts, a hearing loop system is being installed in the church sanctuary on Dec. 4th by Midwest Advantage Computer Systems. This system allows people with hearing aids to access sound from microphones directly to their hearing aids. Harris Miller, one of our church family, has said that the hearing loop systems that he has used "make a remarkable difference." The loop system is wires hidden below the carpet in the sanctuary that are connected to the church's sound system. The sound picked up by the microphone is sent to the sound system, and then it is normally broadcast out through the speakers. With a loop system, the sound is also sent through the loop wires, which sends the sound signal directly to hearing aids. Hearing aids act as receivers and amplify only the sound from the loop system. People can easily set their hearing aids to the hearing loop system, with the push of a button on their hearing aids. Virtually all hearing aids have this function. Trainings will be offered to help people with hearing aids understand how to access the loop system. Watch for more information to come!

AM7 UPDATE

Lay Leader Report 2018

A couple of years ago, the leadership team, with the cooperation of church members, became part of the Healthy Church Initiative process. There was a sense among the leaders that our church needed to do something radically different if we were to continue to be a vibrant, relevant faith community for the next fifty years. After a year of research, surveys, interviews and more, the HCI Consult team made a recommendation.

The Consult Team gave us five recommendations:

- 1) We were to pause all ministries and activities for one year. We were to rest in the goodness of God in order to deepen our walk with Him, deepen our relationships with one another, pray and restore our souls.
- 2) Implement Simple, Soulful, Sunday Mornings. This included ending Kid's Church and having an intergenerational worship time.
- 3) Small Groups for sharing Life and Faith. We were to disband current small groups and build new relationships with one another across generations.
- 4) Devote Wednesday to Community Life with great food and fellowship with each other.

5) Dream a new Dream that takes us into our future. Once we were totally surrendered to God and God began to show us how our church was to be called into this community, we would start to create and design new ministries for God's people.

The Action Ministry Team (AMT) and the Church Management Ministry Team (CMMT) were created to replace our previous leadership structure.

Throughout this past year, the AMT team has been put to work implementing the 5 recommendations given to us. Task force teams were created to work on the 3 legs of Simple, Soulful Sunday mornings, Wednesday Community Life and Small Groups.

You may have noticed how our sermon series at the beginning of the year was building and readying us for opening our hearts and minds to God's calling. We have been "At the Rail", confessing our sins. Next, we surrendered and opened ourselves up to God with our "I Give Up" series. Then we applied the book of 1 John in both our Sunday morning series "Core Strength" and in church-wide small groups with the book "This is How We Know".

The AMT team was also surrendering, giving up through our monthly meetings. The meetings were full of energy and vigor as we encouraged ministries to stop and rest. We struggled with stopping ministries that have defined our church for the past decade. However, most of us agreed that the painful steps we were taking were what our church needed. Like the 1 John series, we needed to focus on the center of who we were, whose we were, and all that we are doing for God.

At our April meeting, we spent the time concentrating on the Bible, meditation and prayer. We found that we don't all take that leap of faith at the same time. We need help to get back to our "First" love, get grounded, and get on that journey of faith. God is leading us. He wants us to follow Jesus' model of "Come, Follow Me." Go out. Be risky. Be bold. It is frightening, but we believe and have hope that this is the journey we're supposed to be on.

In May, we talked about what we hoped to see 5 years from now within our church. What would a new guest entering our church on Sunday or Wednesday encounter? We want them to find opportunities to join groups that facilitate deepening our relationship with God, to see our passion for spiritual development, to witness adult baptism/public affirmations of faith, to see mature/seasoned Christians mentoring new believers, to see a specific process for all level of believers from the basics to sending us out to make new disciples.

In June, AMT had an overnight retreat. The purpose was to move forward with the "dreaming" phase of our journey. We questioned, "How is our church different from any secular group that does "good"? The answer is Jesus. Our dream must be about Jesus. The dreams voiced included: growth in personal relationship with God, walking away from worship feeling filled with the Holy Spirit, focus on relationships, creating a culture of family discipleship, full small groups that are meeting the needs of people where they are at, laying down what's good and finding what's great. We decided that ministry activities should meet all three goals of Love. Grow. Serve. This time away made us a team united in welcoming others into discipleship [by using small groups. God's Spirit was truly present with us.

God gave us a new Mission Statement and it is this:

Forest Hills church is Christ centered, with a focus on making disciples who love God and others, grow in Christ, and serve our wider communities.

This fall Pastor Andrew created a new Family Discipleship group called "Echo". The purpose is to teach parents how to teach our children about living for Christ.

Now, we have begun our Fall Grow Groups. We are offering classes with subjects ranging from spiritual disciplines to grief support to practical living through knitting to Bible study. Everyone is welcome, so come join us and bring a friend.

AMT recommended we continue with our current leadership structure of the AMT Team supporting ministry and CMMT team handling the resources of Forest Hills. At Annual Church Conference on Nov 18, Forest Hills agreed with this proposal.

I am so privileged to be a part of the Action Ministry team and am proud of all of them for the work that has been accomplished this year. We are excited as we look forward to continuing our dreaming in 2019.

Thank you, Pastor David, for your exceptional leadership and thank you to each member of AMT.


