Read: John 21:15-19

Activity: In the repeated interchange between Jesus and Peter, there are slight changes in the language (different words for "love," "feed," "sheep," and "you know." This, it seems, is stylistic and does not carry significance. For more insight, look up: <u>https://www.thegospelcoalition.org/article/a-little-greek-can-be-a-big-distraction/</u>

Reflect: Spend your reflection time seeking to understand what Jesus is doing. Notice that the only other time a coal fire is mentioned in John is when Peter denies Jesus (John 18:18).

Discuss: When Jesus first called Peter, it was after a miraculous catch of fish (Luke 5:1-11). Jesus commissioned them to be fishermen of people. In John 21, again after a miraculous catch of fish, Jesus again commissions Peter, but this time to be a shepherd of His sheep (and give themselves up for the sheep). What is the significance of this change in commissioning? What does this mean/say for you today?

Pray: (On your knees, if possible.) Ask Jesus what He is commissioning you to do for His sheep.

With Kids:

Occupations:

Go through the alphabet and try to come up with a job/ occupation that begins with each letter. Ex: Player 1 begins: "A for Alligator dentist." Next player: "A for Alligator dentist, B for Ballerina" and so on. Try to get through the whole alphabet. Ask: What job from the list would you want most? Why? What job would you want least? Why not?
