

#### From the **Pastor's Perspective**



"Consecrate the fiftieth year and proclaim liberty throughout the land to all its inhabitants. It shall be a jubilee for you...for it is a jubilee and is to be holy for you." -Leviticus 25:10-12

Fifty years ago there were people in the growing community of Forest Lake who felt that God had a plan for a new church community. So, the little band of excited people set out on an adventure that only God saw clearly and that only God could make happen.

Forest Hills (first "Methodist," then "United Methodist") Church was incorporated on Sunday, Dec. 10, 1967 with 32 charter members. Over the next five decades, the church grew, and our identity and purpose were forged. We are anchored in a personal and passionate love-relationship with Jesus, a reliance on the grace of God, and the leading and empowering of the Holy Spirit. Our message of hope is biblically grounded. Our faith is lived and expressed together by reaching out to others in acts service and in sharing of faith. We value intergenerational relationships and being a small church that includes and values each unique person as God's precious child.

Last year we encapsulated this spiritual identity and purpose in our motto: "Love. Grow. Serve." This is who we are. This is who we've become. And this is who we are called to continue to be in the next 50 years!

On Sunday, Dec. 10, 2017 we will gather to celebrate our church's 50th anniversary. Our celebration is "50-Year Jubilee: Remember. Renew. Rejoice!" We are celebrating by declaring

We are FORGED. The teens of Forest Hills have named their program Forged. This comes from the Bible Verse Proverbs 27:17.

#### "As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another."

Our goal as a youth group is to sharpen one another—in times of meeting, fellowship, or any other interaction. So, what does it mean to sharpen?

When a knife becomes dull it is less effective to carry out its purpose. As are we when we become "dull" in our faith. We need the fellowship and accountability of other believers to sharpen us. But this is what the sign really said: "Hurry! If you are not panicking yet, you should be! There are sales to be had and lists to cross off! Don't you

know you need to have all your ducks in a row? Christmas is no joke! It's big business! Start shopping now so you will still have time to shop later!"

Seriously...don't remind me. Do we really need the countdown sign? Doesn't everyone know where Christmas falls on the calendar?

The answer is yes...yes, we do. Of course people are aware that Dec. 25<sup>th</sup> denotes a holiday in which people are off from work, families gather and gifts are exchanged. However, if we are not careful, the meaning of it all can be easily lost. Wal-Mart may be on to something with their countdown signs...they know it reminds people. It helps them prepare. But we know the marketing team at Wal-Mart did not originate such an idea. A time of reminding and preparation is a Christian notion. While we do not post signs at our church entrance, we keep a countdown as well. It's called Advent.

Our message is vastly different however. What Advent is really saying is this: "Take some time...slow down. Take a look at who you are and what you spend time doing. Is there anything you'd like to change? Your Savior is near...he'll help you. He has come to save the entire world. Listen to his message. Celebrate your King."

Advent is a crucial time, if we pay attention to it. It is a time to repent of our sins, to quietly draw close to Jesus as we count down the days to his arrival as a baby born in Bethlehem.

Truthfully, we can't really fault Walmart. They exist as a business to make a profit. But we are the church. We provide meaning and sanity to a culture gone mad with consumption. We provide Advent. In our church services we count down the weeks until Christmas by lighting candles. Candles provide a very clear reminder that Jesus, the Light of the World, has come to save us from the darkness of sin. As the flame reminds us of this truth, our prayers prepare us for his coming.

A good way to remind and prepare ourselves and our families is to go through an Advent devotional together. There are many available and they are typically very inexpensive or even free online. Take advantage of Advent this year and find the cure to the common consumption!
