Ephesians 1:18

What is God's plan for our church? This is the question that we have been asking intentionally for a year now. (It's a question we should always be asking as a church, right?) We want to discern God's leading. We want to be the church that God has called us to be. We want to be at the center of God's will. We've been a busy, faithful, and God-centered congregation. We have tried hard to live into our mission to "be the visible light of Christ in our communities." We have also tried hard to reach new people for Jesus.

We do so many things well: we serve, we work hard, we are generous, we welcome people, we care for others. We show Christ's light in so many concrete ways. Yet a growing concern has been that we struggle to build lasting relationships with new people. For all that we have tried to reach out, we are not getting the measurable results we have been hoping for. We are getting frustrated that nothing we seem to be trying is working! We are doing good work, but we are shrinking—in numbers, in resources, in energy. This is not the future we want for our church!

Last fall we committed to apply for the Healthy Church Initiative (HCI) grant and program offered by the Minnesota Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church. We were selected! Since then, we have been praying together for us to discern God's leading. We've also compiled an in-depth self-study of our congregation and our community. (By the way, if anyone would like a copy of the self-study, the office can email or print one out for you).

This past weekend four HCI coaches met with people from the congregation in a variety of ways, and came on site to learn us better. They have worked through our self-study and draw upon their collective learning of how churches can be vital in today's context.

These coaches are presenting a proposal for our church to consider. They will list the five strengths and five challenges they see in our congregation. They will then provide five prescriptions, targeting five different vital areas, that they invite us to consider.

We hope that all the hard work and prayerful discernment by all of us will produce some fruitful direction. I'll be quite up front with you: I hope the prescriptions call for something radical. I don't want just some more ideas to try. We've been trying. I want something that will call us to transformation. Rev. Susan Nienaber, our District Superintendent, told us that vital churches have learned to surrender themselves totally to God ("Not my will, but

yours be done, Heavenly Father!" - see Matt. 26:42). We have been following in Jesus' footsteps since Christmas, and this is one thing that we have learned over and over again: its to surrender and let God be in charge. Are we ready for this? I mean, not just verbal assent. Are we ready to lay EVERYTHING on the table; give it all to God? We want God to do amazing things. God will, but we have to let Him have complete control.

This Easter, we learned again how God brings resurrection out of death. When we die to self (and let our personal wants for our church die) God will bring about new life. It may not be in the way we expect, however! "Letting go and letting God" means letting our church become what God wants. Yet with God, we always find that what God does is far better and greater than we could have hoped for. Surrendering our church to God means having a hopeful anticipation for something better than it is now, or than what we could craft.

Ephesians 1:18 is a prayer that God's light would flood our hearts, and that we would grasp the hope that comes from what God chooses for us. God has glorious blessings in store for us as God's people at Forest Hills.

Let's prepare to receive what God is telling us through this HCl discernment process. Let's let go of how we do things now. Let's let go of how we do things now. Let's let go of the way we want things to be. Let's let go of being in control, being "in the know," and being content. Let's be open to the flooding of God's light in our hearts. Prepare to receive a glorious blessing!

Kid's Korner

Spring has sprung and around here it has been the rainy season. I guess April showers really do bring May flowers! It always strikes be how brilliant and bright the grass appears after it receives some rain. We might consider the weather to be a bit gloomy, but there is more going on in the world than just our preference for sunshine. Rain seems to cause the earth to rejoice. It blooms and thrives in response. The beauty of the earth, the food we eat, the creatures that surround us are all sustained by precious water.

Kids seem to have a natural affinity to water. They love to be out while the rain is falling. There is a certain pleasure that comes from feeling the cold droplets on one's face. They love to splash in puddles. They love mud. My kids are always wanting to go swimming. With little regard to the depth of the water, they plunge right in! Their desire to play overpowers their fear and common sense.

All life depends upon water. And all eternal life depends upon Living Water. Jesus has come to offer himself to us, to sustain us and revive us. Do we long for him as a plant longs for water? Do we need his presence in a constant way? Some of us have developed a resistance to the continual need for water. This results in the cactus type: prickly, crusty and difficult to approach.

Some of us experience this Living Water as a welcomed cold drink, but some of us need more of a splash in the face. Sometimes Jesus seems to provide comfort and peace like a gently bubbling hot tub. Sometimes he is a raging river carrying us into the rapids. What is your experience of Jesus? How have you come in contact with the Living Water? Ask yourself, your family members and your children this same question. It is often hard to talk about Jesus, especially with our kids. It is hard to understand how he is present and alive and yet not here with us in the flesh. It is hard when it seems like we are praying to the air. God knows this is a challenge for us. The Bible acknowledges it. That's why we have the ineffable mysteries of God spoken into everyday things! Jesus is Living Water, the Bread of Life, the Light of the World. We can experience and participate with God in strange but concrete ways through baptism and communion. God is here with us on this earth. All creation reflects his glory!

Getting a hold of Jesus can be a frustrating endeavor. It can feel like we are trying to grasp water in our fist. The good news is that he has risen! He is with us in the here and now and he offers to us "a spring of water welling up to eternal life" (John 4:14). If we could only be as the grass that exists with the all too keen knowledge of its utter dependency on the rain.

May the Lord plant us, our children and our grandchildren into the fertile soil of faith reliant on our unending source of Living Water, Jesus Christ.
