📖 Memory Verse (review at least once a day):

“Dear friends, let’s love each other, because love is from God, and everyone who loves is born from God and knows God. ... God is love.” ~1 John 4:7-8

☞ Digging Deeper ☞

Read: Read: 1 John 1:1-7

Reflect: The New Testament identifies 4 different kinds of love: brotherly love, erotic love, being loving (kind and affectionate), and love of commitment and self-sacrificing. In what ways do you act out of each of these loves. With whom? Why?

Discuss: Describe a relationship based on true, self-giving love. Where have you experienced that in your life, even if just in part?

Activity: Look for how the word “love” is used around you (community, media, computer, magazines, etc.). Keep track of how frequently love refers to each of the above four kinds of love. What does this suggest our culture believes about love?

Pray: Take a verse or two from 1 Corinthians (the “Love Chapter”) and use it to form your prayer.
