The Dream: Discipleship!

"You have heard me teach things that have been confirmed by many reliable witnesses. Now teach these truths to other trustworthy people who will be able to pass them on to others." -2 Timothy 2:2

The primary purpose of the life of a Jesus-follower is to love God and love others. Check out the "Greatest Commandments" in Mark 12:28-34. We can use Bible-language to say it another way. It is: To be a disciple of Jesus, and, to make disciples for Jesus. The mission statement of the United Methodist Church puts it this way: Our mission is "to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world."

As a church, we've been "dreaming a new dream," trying to capture what God's calling is for our church's next 50 years! We've paused many activities and functions. We've been praying and listening to God and each other. We've been seeking God's dream!

Our church leadership believes that we've discerned that God is calling us to take seriously a singular focus on discipleship: being and making disciples. This focus on discipleship will shape and form all that we do as a church from now on. For example, we've been evaluating how effectively our ministry to children is guiding them into discipleship. provide Christian education opportunities. It means that Christian adults, us in the church, must take seriously the calling to make disciples of whomever children God has placed in our influence. It means that we need to equip families to make disciples of their own children within the context of their homes and families. Discipleship happens in relationships. We need to foster those relationships! Take a look at Pastor Andrew's article for a better description of this.

This new focus will bring radical change to our church. When the disciples first chose to follow Jesus, they left behind their old way of doing things. We will experience some of this—if not a lot!—in our church, too. Everything we do as a church must make disciples in a real and direct way.

Part of our struggle in our church's recent past is that we have accepted church activities to be things that we, who are already disciples, like to do together. This is not discipleship. This is a country club! Serving and helping others isn't discipleship, either. That's just a service organization. Discipleship means intentionally and actively growing in Christ ourselves, and then intentionally and actively helping others grow in Christ. This means meeting new people, building new relationships. This means talking about God in our normal conversations. It means bringing up Jesus when we talk with others. It means serving others in a way that encourages them to take the next step in their faith journeys. Hoping they will is not good enough. We want to see evidence of people growing spiritually, both in us who are part of this church, and in those who are not here yet.

This means we will need to be willing to be pushed to make disciples. We can't just say it or talk about it. We need to do it...and put our time, energy, and resources into doing it. It means change. It means seeing more people getting involved. It doesn't mean that other people do it. It means we each do it. Discipling means building a deepening relationship with others. Our question to ourselves is, "Who am I

discipling?" What are their names? How many times have you had Jesus-conversations with them?

Fall Message Series

Join the Rebellion: The Real Star Wars!

This fall we start a new Confirmation class. It is open to students entering the 7th, 8th, and 9th grade. The purpose of confirmation is to prepare young people to confirm for themselves the vows to receive Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Savior. To prepare young people to do this, the class of confirmation will provide a basic and fundamental understanding of the Christian faith. Fall Grow Groups

Grow Groups start again in October!

This cycle we will begin offering a variety of studies in three different categories: 1. *Learn*: Bible: Groups will learn about the Bible. This October we'll have two groups studying the Bible. 2. *Live*: Life application: Groups will concentrate on living out their Christian faith in daily life. This October our application will be learning and doing spiritual practices, ways that we stay connected to God. 3. *reLate*: Specific issues: Groups will explore particular issues or topics that relate to the current needs and issues people are facing, and how their Christian faith guides them. Summer came to a close with an AMAZING turn out for our end of summer Waterpark day. We had 19 youth group kids and their friends spend the day at Bunker Beach. What a fun way to end the summer.

I am excited to start our regular youth group schedule back up this Sept. I also have some exciting new changes to announce! First off, youth group will be meeting Wednesday nights immediately following dinner and running till 7:30pm. Secondly, I will also be looking for parent/ adult volunteers to participate every week. If we have enough the rotation would be volunteering once every 6 weeks or so.

This year the youth group is going to focus on sharing our faith; making disciples of those around us. We will be starting out the year talking about why we need to "Do Life Together" and then we will spend 3 weeks talking about "Do Not Fly SOLO." Once we understand the importance of being with others in the Christian faith we will discuss "Looking Back to Your Friends' Future." This message series will discuss the importance of sharing our faith with our friends for their eternity.

At the end of Sept. we will be joining up with Immanuel Baptist Church for "See you at the Pole" and pray with the teens at Forest Lake High School. "See you at the pole" is an annual gathering of thousands of Christian students at a flagpole in front of their local schools for prayer, scripture-reading and worship, during the early morning before school starts.

KID'S CORNER

Join in the ECHO

The Gospel of Jesus is the greatest story ever told. It is the only story by which we can be saved. It has been the role of the Church since the book of Acts to be the gathered people of God who tell this story, over and over and over again. The story of Jesus' life, death and resurrection is the ECHO, and we as disciples are to repeat it. After we have told the story, we are to tell it again. And then again. To our friends, to our family members, and most of all, to our children.

God has graciously given us some much-needed advice in Deuteronomy 11: "Fix these words of mine in your hearts and minds; tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. Teach them to your children, talking about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates."

But this is not only a parental call. We are all here to make disciples, and before that can happen, we need to first ensure that we are disciples in the first place. This is where our Wednesday night ECHO comes in. Here is how it will work:

5:30 - We gather together to eat dinner and visit.

6:15 – We move into the sanctuary where we get to hear Biblical truth echoed. Some will learn something brand-new, some will learn something in a new way, some will be enlivened to hear God's truth again.

7:15 – Everyone is dismissed to repeat the ECHO at home, in school, with their neighbors...

There are three crucial parts we need to pull off the ECHO:

- 1. Biblical truth
- 2. Disciples seriously seeking to follow Jesus
- 3. New people!

We certainly have the first one covered! Our church has Bibles everywhere! I think we are in good shape with number two. People here love Jesus! If we have the first two in place, then the third item is a breeze. If we love Jesus and know the truth of his word, then we must invite others to know and love him too!

What not to expect:

Ease

Discipleship is not easy. Jesus told us that it would involve taking up our own cross, dying to ourselves and the like.

To love everything

Our goal is discipleship not entertainment. This goes for both kids and adults. We are going to Incorporate many aspects of learning and engagement. We are going to involve all the generations. Not everyone will love everything we do all the time. This is okay. We come for the interests of others.

The Status Quo

We are trying something totally new! As a church family, we want to be able to meet the spiritual needs of those families who come into our doors. We believe that intergenerational ministry is a strength of our church and that God is calling us to live into this strength. This means that all of us, old and young alike, should have the spiritual well-being of the other at heart.

What to expect:

Challenge

God is calling us to step up and do the hard work of teaching others, praying for others, keeping others accountable, and engaging new people.

Growth

If we can focus on applying God's word to our lives in a place where others are doing the same, we will find that God will use such an environment to grow us closer to him. If we abide in him, we will bear much fruit.

Adoption

Make no mistake, ECHO is our kid's ministry. But kids do not discover Jesus by virtue of one teacher in a classroom. They find Jesus in the context of a family. Kids ministry needs parents and other adults! The church will become obsolete if we do not prioritize the next generation. We need older adults and those who are not parents to connect with and pour into the kids involved in our church. For those kids who do not have parents on board, we need adults who will be willing to give of themselves and essentially adopt such a kid; to become a spiritual parent.

The world we live in is hostile to the Christian faith. The way things have been done in the past no longer work. Satan is on the prowl looking to devour the next generation of believers. You and I are being called into this battle. Will we engage in the fight and make disciples, or will we stand by and watch the future fade?

To paraphrase Joshua, "As for me and my church, we will serve the Lord!"
