Being a Disciple AND Making Disciples

"Jesus said, 'Come, follow me, and I'll show you how to fish for people.'" -Matt. 4:19

Discipleship is what being a Christian looks like. Being a Christian is not just accepting a set of beliefs about God. It's not just holding certain religious truths. When Jesus called people, He didn't just call them to believe a certain way. He called them to follow Him. He called them to be His disciples. That's the key difference.

Disciples follow. Being a Christian means that we are disciples of Jesus. The first Christians in the Bible were called "followers of The Way." Christianity, from the beginning, was a way of life. It was behaviors as well as beliefs.

Disciples grow. Disciples don't stay the same. As we follow Jesus, as we walk in His way, His way changes us. The Holy Spirit is at work in our lives to remove those beliefs, attitudes and behaviors that are not godlike. The Holy Spirit pours into us so that the fruit of the spirit pours out of us. We can be a Christian in our beliefs, worship and service. But to grow requires that we authentically engage God, others, and ourselves—applying our faith to our lived, daily lives. This we do best in small groups. We will be starting our next grow group session in February. Be sure to sign up for one!

Pastor's Perspective Cont'd

Disciples make disciples. When Jesus called people to be His disciples, He said, "Follow me, and I will show you how to fish for others." Do you see the two parts of discipleship? One is following Jesus as a disciple. Yet, equally important is the second part: making more disciples. We can lose this crucial second part. We can make our Christian faith just about what we believe and do. But Jesus calls His disciples to make more disciples. Its what disciples do! You cannot be a true disciple of Jesus if you are not making more disciples. That's why Jesus gave the Great Commandment ("love God totally" Matt. 22:37) AND the Great Commission ("Go into all the world and make disciples" Matt. 28:16).

Disciples make disciples who make disciples. This means, then, that our goal is not just to win people for Jesus. It's not to get people to convert to the Christian faith. It is to make disciplemaking disciples. This radically changes what we do as Christians. This radically changes what we do as a church! This means we have to mentor other disciples. We invest in others in order to shape and form them into disciple-making disciples.

Our church has re-written our mission statement to really highlight the central calling of discipleship. Our church's mission is: "Forest Hills is Christ-centered, with a focus on making disciples who love God and others, grow in Christ, and serve our wider communities." The biblical call is not just to be a disciple, but to make disciples! When we only do the first, we become spiritual consumers. Yet God has called us to join His mission. Living a life of mission is the life of a disciple.

Our Sunday message series this winter is going to help us focus on this priority of discipleship. The series is called, "Disciples make" Each week we'll take a closer look at a fundamental component of dynamic discipleship: 1. Disciples, 2. Jesus #1, 3. The Holy Spirit Their Guide, 4. Growth Happen, 5. God Talk, 6. Stands, 7. Friends, and 8. A Difference. We'll also offer a couple of grow groups in February that will dovetail with these themes. Finally, A book I would recommend to help you is *10 Qualities that Move You from a Believer to a Disciple*, by Dennis Rouse.
