Thresholds

"Lift up your heads, O gates! And be lifted up, O ancient doors, that the King of glory may come in." -Psalm 24:7

The Bible is a collection of 66 different books: 39 books in the Old Testament and 27 in the New Testament. Each of the books tells its own stories, and each story has its own characters and setting. These stories span over 2,000 years of history.

Yet the Bible is also all one book, with one main story. It's the story of God's salvation for people. All the books and stories of the Old Testament demonstrate, foretell and point to the coming of God's "final answer" in the coming of the promised Messiah ("Christ" in Greek, and "Savior" in English). The New Testament's first four books tell the life story of the Messiah who has come. His name is Jesus, and His story on earth—and the story of salvation of the whole Bible—climaxes in Jesus' death on a cross and His resurrection from the dead. The rest of the New Testament tells how the first followers lived their lives of discipleship.

March 6th is Ash Wednesday, the first day of the season called "Lent." It's the six weeks before Easter, and during this time we reflect on our human condition of sin and our need for a savior. We begin with a worship service on Ash Wednesday at 6:30 p.m.

Pastor's Perspective Cont'd

This year during Lent we're going to retell the main story of the Bible, from the first book of the Bible to the last. We're calling this series "Thresholds: The story of the Bible, the Story of Salvation." When Adam and Eve first sinned in the Garden of Eden, they were expelled from the Garden and a guard was placed at its entrance (Genesis 4:7). Then, throughout the rest of the Old Testament, doors, entrances, and gates keep popping up in

stories. (For example, great emphasis is placed on the door of Noah's Ark, the Passover doorframe, and the temple doorways.)

When Jesus is baptized, the heavens are "opened" (Mark 1:10). Jesus later proclaims, "I am the door!" (John 10:9). When Jesus dies, the temple doorway curtain is torn in two. When He is raised, the stone covering the tomb entrance is rolled away. Jesus calls His followers to enter the narrow gate (Matt.7:13) and open their heart doors to let Him in (Rev. 3:20). The story of the Bible concludes with the pearly gates of heaven opened to all those who follow Jesus (Rev. 21:21).

The story of the Bible can be told in thresholds! And that's what we are going to do. Join us this Lent for a journey through the Bible. We'll cross the thresholds of the stories all along the way, and open the Door of Salvation. At Easter, Jesus will come out of the threshold of His tomb, and we will be invited to open our heart doors to invite Him to come in.

It begins when you come out the door of your home, open the car door to travel to the church, get out through the same car door, and cross the front door threshold of our church building, each Sunday morning. Get ready to rediscover the story of the Bible. Here we go, step on through!

General Conference Special Session

The special General Conference session of the global United Methodist Church met this past weekend from Friday evening through Tuesday. This special session called delegates from all over the world to St. Louis, MO, as the United Methodist Church's top governing body to find a way forward together on the complexities of human sexuality. The General Conference body defeated all proposals to change the current stance of the United Methodist Church as outlined in the official *United Methodist Book of Discipline*. The United Methodist Church will continue it's official position that "homosexuality is incompatible
