

From the Pastor's Perspective

I write this month's article as I face a very calm Lake Koronis. I, and many others from our church are spending the week at Red Rock camp, deepening our faith, connecting with friends and hosing off children who have spent their free time playing in a large mud hole. Things don't always go as planned at camp or in life.

Some of you have been following along with the developments of the decisions made at the special session of the General Conference of the United Methodist Church. At that meeting, delegates from around the world voted on whether or not the denomination ought to change its stance on homosexuality. Generally speaking, the United States and other western delegates, were in favor of changing the language within the book of discipline in order to allow for LGBTQ individuals to serve as clergy as well as to preside over same-sex weddings. Also, generally speaking, the African and Asian delegates, held to a more traditional view on sexuality and marriage. In the end, the majority vote fell to the traditionalists.

No outcome however could deny our current divisions. Traditionalists and progressives cannot agree on this issue, but does that mean we can't live together, serve together and love Jesus together?

At last month's Minnesota Annual Conference, our collective churches voted to take a stand against the determination made by General Conference. Many feel that barring LGBTQ people from church leadership roles is unjust and harmful.

Pastor's Perspective Cont'd

They feel that these individuals should be affirmed and fully included within the life of the church at all levels.

The traditionalist view holds homosexuality to be a sin and that God's plan for LGBTQ people includes re-evaluating life choices. This perspective holds that those in church leaderships ought not to be actively living into and affirming a sinful lifestyle.

Both perspectives claim to be biblical. Both claim they affirm the sacred nature of all humans. Both believe they have a better path for the future of the church.

The UMC church as an institution has become stuck. Too many people are pulling in too many directions. In my opinion, we have lost the right focus. In our conference, we spent nearly all of our three days together discussing this topic. It was a misuse of time and missed opportunity. As it is now, Minnesota has decided to repudiate the current wording of our discipline and stand for inclusion of LGBTQ clergy.

At this point, there is no knowing what this means specifically. This new vision, however, has paved a way toward division. This is not Jesus' hope or will for his body. The Apostle Paul hammers over and over again the importance and necessity of unity. Yet, we find ourselves in the midst of division anyway.

No matter what you personally think about these conferences and votes, it is only God's opinion that really counts. Of course, we all have our opinions about what God thinks! Sigh...

In hard times, divisive times, unknowing times, we are called to be about the work of producing fruit. The fields may seem dry and bare, they may seem worked over or neglected...maybe they have even been sabotaged by the enemy. No matter our perceptions, Scripture assures us that the harvest is plentiful! Workers are needed (Matt. 9:38)!

As we continue to cultivate the fruit of the Spirit in our summer series at Forest Hills Church, we can keep higher church developments and conference correspondences in our periphery, but our focus must remain on the fields in which we are planted. We seek to allow God to produce fruit in us that can be used to feed and nurture those whom He brings in. Our work is not political, nor agenda driven. It is a clear call to make disciples and help heal a broken world. We do this by LOVING, GROWING, and SERVING...not by debating, voting, and dividing.

May your summer be blessed, and may you find your faith fruitful!

Worship's Word

"Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom." - 2 Corinthians 3:17

Hello church! Here we are in July already—Happy Independence Day! Never a better time than July 4th to stop and praise God for the freedoms that we enjoy in these United States and to pray for those who do not have the same blessing in this world.

The month of July will be a busy one at Forest Hills. As we continue through our sermon series *Fruit of the Spirit* we will see Cassi Betker bringing God's word on July 7th, Steve Ruter on the 14th, and Pastor Andrew on July 28th. Both Pastor Andrew and I will split time leading worship, as we did in June.

I bet you're thinking "what about July 21st?" Well, we have a special worship service that day.
