

From the Pastor's Perspective

For many, this time of year marks the beginning of a hope filled foray into the world of gardening. Seeds are planted with no other purpose than to produce fruit (or vegetables). No one endeavors to prepare soil and plant seeds unless there is a future crop in mind. The intermediary time then, is a struggle. Abundant amounts of water have to be provided, critters have to be warded off, and the most mundane and pervasive threat of all must be managed: weeds. A newly planted seed has a lot stacked against it. The gardener has his work cut out for him.

For a garden to be successful it must be tended to... constantly. We know this so well in fact that for those of us who do not plant gardens, the work involved is usually cited as our main deterrent! It's not that I dislike fresh produce, but I am not quite up for the investment that is needed to protect and nurture my plants.

A good garden requires work, but surely in the scheme of our lives, a vegetable garden in the backyard would probably not top our list of concerns. We only have so much time in the day. Only so much capacity to expend ourselves. This reality forces us to evaluate our priorities. What do we deem most important? Why? And how much of our limited resources are we going to invest into these things?

As Christians our list of priorities ought to be different than those found in our culture. Just as a professional gardener must give his plants first consideration, a Christian must dedicate time and energy toward spiritual development and

growth. This alone might sound like a pretty good goal. Spiritual growth sounds like a great outcome, but it is not helpful to keep our terms vague. The Apostle Paul clarifies: "I say be guided by the Spirit and you won't carry out your selfish desires...the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. There is no law against things like this" (Galatians 5:16, 22-24).

This summer we turn our attention to the work of gardening by addressing the question: How can we cultivate the fruit of the Spirit in our lives and in the life of the church? Each week we will consider one of the fruits listed by Paul and take a close look at how the culture in which we live inhibits growth. Philip D. Kenneson's book *Life on the Vine: Cultivating the Fruit of the Spirit in Christian Community* provides a helpful framework for digging into this topic, so come to church ready to get your hands dirty!

"Life on the Vine" is a 10-week series which will cover most of the summer. A few Sundays will feature a guest preacher as well as a visit from the MN Adult and Teen Challenge Choir on July 21st. God's word guides us as we take on the challenge of being transformed into bearers of his fruit!

Pastor David on Renewal Leave This Summer!

Starting June 3, I will be on Renewal Leave until Labor Day! I will not be engaging in any pastoral duties at Forest Hills Church, and I will be attending worship elsewhere during this time.

Renewal leave of up to six months is offered to conference-appointed, full-time pastors who have served for at least six years. As pastors are "on call" 24/7, often work well above normal hours, and continually engage in high-stress situations and responsibilities, our Minnesota Annual Conference recommends a minimum of one month renewal leave every six years (in addition to vacation time) in order to alleviate pastoral burnout. It is a time to fall in love again with pastoral ministry, to receive a fresh approach to a pastor's current ministry context, and to recharge one's passion and zeal.

To be honest, I have never taken any renewal leave in my 24 years of pastoral ministry! My brother, a United Methodist pastor in Wisconsin, took a three-month Renewal Leave two years ago and was so blessed by it that he ordered me to take one, too! "Your church needs you to do it!" he said.

God has seemed to put all the pieces together to make this happen. Pastor Andrew was appointed full-time to our church last summer and will be able to provide the pastoral coverage during my absence. This is the summer before our daughter goes to college. I was approved by both the Conference and our local church's leadership for the leave. My wife's employer offered her an extended leave from her job for seven weeks so we could travel together! It will be a summer of education in European history and culture as a family. Our Conference also provides some financial support to help cover the cost of additional staff that is brought on for pastoral coverage. Pastor Dan Hair and Steve Ruter will provide ministry assistance for Pastor Andrew each week. The Sundays that Andrew will be preaching, others will lead music worship. See the Sunday schedule list in this newsletter, on the church website, and each week in the worship bulletin. Although I believe that this time away will be a blessing to my future pastoral ministry at Forest Hills, I also trust that God will use it as a time of blessing for the church. I have full confidence in Pastor Andrew's ability to lead the church during my absence, and I also believe that Forest Hills is a strong and vital church that will continue to flourish and serve God unabated.

I want to personally thank everyone for making this Renewal Leave possible and for supporting me and my family by doing all the extra work this requires. It is a gift! May God bless us all and make us stronger disciples.

Worship's Word

"The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness can never extinguish it." - John 1:5

June has arrived! With Rev. Dr. Werner and his family on sabbatical, Pastor Andrew will be covering the "Pastor's Perspective" and I have the honor and privilege of bringing the Worship news for the summer. Who am I? Good question! I am Amanda Lucas, helping to fill the worship shoes for the next few months. You'll usually find me seated behind the drums during Sunday worship, and you still will this summer, but I'm thrilled to be helping to lead worship several times while Pastor David is away. This month, Pastor Andrew and I will be splitting time at the worship helm. Throughout the summer, we will have a handful of guest leaders for worship. Stay tuned for the July newsletter to see who is coming up.

This new month of June sees Forest Hills moving into the summer schedule now that school has ended/is ending for most. A new month also means a new song on Sunday mornings. For June, we'll be introducing the song *Hope Has a Name* by River Valley Worship. It is on 98.5 KTIS frequently, so keep your ears open for that!

Confession: I love Pentecost Sunday. We will be celebrating this on the 9th and, for the third or fourth year in a row, I will be leading worship. I originally loved Pentecost because this was one of two times during the liturgical calendar year that we could wear our RED choir stoles...red is my favorite color, just in case my car, guitar, and several shirts I own didn't tip you off!

Once I was more aware of what Pentecost represented as far as the Holy Spirit coming down like tongues of fire on the disciples and the others gathered near Jerusalem, I realized that this seventh Sunday since Easter isn't just another church holiday — it is the beginning of the Christian church. Pentecost is a celebration of the power and very personal presence of the Holy Spirit. It was the day, hour, minute, and second that God equipped us to spread the word, in many languages, to all corners of the Earth. It was an absolute game changer. From that time on, God's empowering Holy Spirit lives within us, equipping us for the tasks ahead, never leaving us alone.

The imagery of Pentecost between the color red, the flame, and the mighty rushing wind (Acts 2) has always been amazing to me. Fire/flame is representative of heat and light but also of power and glory – God's power and glory. The rushing wind has always brought to mind the breath of life that God brings to us. What a combination! Fire plus wind equals a blaze – He wants us to be on fire for Him! There is a worship song called *Consuming Fire* that encapsulates this perfectly: "Consuming fire fan into flame, a passion for Your Name, Spirit of God fall in this place, Lord have Your way, Lord have Your way with us." Hint: we'll probably be singing this on the 9th!

Before this first Edge article I've ever written becomes a thesis on Pentecost, the Greek root of it's name, early church traditions and so forth, I'll just leave you with this thought: the very same Holy Spirit that came down on Peter, John, James, and Mary is the same one that lives in us today. The Spirit is the same one that was present at the beginning. Mind blowing!

A Note from Mary:

As I prepare to leave Forest Lake and Hugo to return to the area of the Twin Cities where my roots are, I have had a lot of time to think about what I am leaving, and where I am going. I did not make this decision lightly. In fact, until my daughter Holly started talking about it, it wasn't even something I was considering.

When I came to Forest Lake almost 13 years ago, I came here because my whole life had been torn apart. I was in a lot of emotional pain, and was looking to heal and recover from the damage. One of the first people I met was Steve Ruter. He came to the place I was living and offered us "Forest Hills Church." I had been very active in church prior to my life going down the tubes, and instantly felt a connection with this church and all of you here. This church has a servant's heart. I found that very comforting, and it was something I wanted to be a part of. Off and on, throughout my 13 years in Forest Lake, I have found myself coming back here. I always felt at home here, and it was because of all of you.

During this time of "thinking about moving back down to where I'm from," I've had time to consider the ramifications of this decision. Obviously, I have to find a new job, and I have some friends here; but the most difficult part of moving for me is going to be leaving all of you. I am not a perfect Christian, and I don't attend church often enough (yes, I'm aware), but I love ALL of you, and I'm going to miss you; I'm going to miss this church; I'm going to miss the activities I've been a part of, and I'm going to miss the job! However, the most interesting thing that I've learned during this time of reflection is that when I moved here, I was leaving those who hurt me. And while I found love and healing in this church (even without regular attendance!), its time for me to "go back home." Its time for me to re-connect with family, become (hopefully) a Grammy, and re-introduce myself back into society. Its time for me to "get a life." You see, I have kept myself locked away, and that was something I didn't realize. Only by considering moving did I realize that, in a sense, coming to Forest

Lake allowed me to "run away from home." It wasn't until I decided to move that I realized I am going back home! My heart is filled with joy! I also plan on continuing to attend a United Methodist Church. In fact, I will be right down the road from River Hills UMC, and will check that out first. I will also be looking for another Office Administrative position in a UMC.

I want to thank you for all that you've given me. I've learned so much from all of you, and have never felt more loved. That is the gift this church brings to the community of Forest Lake. I will miss you, and I will always have a place in my heart for the people of Forest Hills United Methodist Church. I wish you all the very best, and hope to live up to the gifts of love and service that you have shown me.
