

## From the Pastor's Perspective

This has been a bit of a whirlwind summer for me. Filling in for Pastor David has been a welcomed challenge and a blessing. Pivoting roles is an interesting experience and I have been grateful for the opportunity. As far as our preaching schedule, we will continue to look at "Life on the Vine" and think through how we can cultivate the remaining Fruit of the Spirit.

In the Gospels, Jesus teaches: "Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a basket. Instead, they put it on top of a lampstand, and it shines on all who are in the house" (Matthew 5:15). Additionally, in the book of Revelation, churches are represented by lamps (Rev. 1:20). So, I don't think it is a stretch to say that our church should function as a lamp, a lamp that has been set up in a place called Forest Lake, MN. As a lamp, our job is to shine as brightly where we are planted. We here not shine as brightly within our own walls. No, we are here to shine brightly for all who might have eyes to see, not just for those who might be members.

The Bible tells us that we must shine, but it is less clear on how we ought to go about doing the shining. God has largely left the "how" up to the individual lamps. As we move into August, allow me to share with you a couple of the ways our church is looking to shine brightly in our community.

We continue our partnership with St. Andrew's Family Shelter that provides temporary housing for parents and kids who find themselves without a home.

# Forest Hills Youth Group



On July 13th, very early in the morning, 12 of us (7 teens and 5 adults) from Forest Hills flew up to Alaska for a seven-day mission trip. Once we landed we met with our team leaders, Dennis, Mary and Michelle from Praying Pelican Missions. They took us into Anchorage for a few hours to get some food and see the state. Some of us tried reindeer sausage, it was pretty good. Then we headed up to Wasilla, 45 minutes north west of Anchorage.

In Wasilla, we worked with four different mission groups; Church of the Nazaerene, Thrifter's Rock, Frontline and Alaska Bible College. The group did miscellaneous projects for the church like painting rooms. Thrifter's Rock is similar a thrift shop where all

the profits goes to the local church. Our group helped them with pricing, cleaning and prepping donations.

Frontline was our main connection in Wasilla, they are similar to our Helping Hands. Each year they do a HUGE clothing give away. Our team sorted, folded and organized an entire gym full of clothes. Saturday, July 20th, they served over 1000 people with the clothes and school supplies, we helped prepare. We also helped paint, tore down cupboards and retile a few rooms for them. During the week Frontline does two free meals for the community, that we were able to be apart of. This gave us the opportunity to really get to know the people of Wasilla. We met numerous people that had part of their story in Minnesota. We also met people with broken hearts and lives depending on the services of Frontline. After the evening meal there was a worship service. The next day after the meal they had a food give away to get the people through the next week. The teens were able to help the people with shopping and carrying their groceries to their cars. I was so proud of their welcoming attitudes to all the people they met.

At the Alaska Bible College, we (or really Ann Klinner) did a lot of tiling. The group helped retile two full

bathrooms. We also tore down an old shed and did heavy landscaping so they could expand their parking lot. The President of the college, told us they had prayed the whole year for a mission team would choose Wasilla to partner with them for the work that needed to be done. He also reminded us that the work we did that week would have ripple effects as the students from that college went on to be pastors, missionaries, worship leaders for the Kingdom of God.

I was so proud of our group, Forest Hills servant heart shined through the whole week. We really have a great group of hard working and faithful people here at Forest Hills. I am proud that we were able to further Kingdom work in Alaska.
