Once In Royal David's City

Once in royal Davids city, Stood a lowly cattle shed, Where a mother laid her Baby, In a manger for His bed: Mary was that mother mild, Jesus Christ, her little Child.

"And our eyes at last shall see Him, through His own redeeming love; for that child so dear and gentle is our Lord in heaven above; and He leads His children on to the place where He has gone." -Once in Royal David's City, st. 4

December brings the great celebration of Christmas, and we mark the end of our calendar year by celebrating the coming of our Savior. As a church (and individually) this gives us a helpful perspective as we look back and look forward. All that we have done must point to Jesus. All that we are going to do must embolden us to follow Him.

We recently had our Church Conference, where we assess our work as a church together. Two years ago we embarked on a radical year of Jubilee in celebration of our church's 50th anniversary. We simplified our structure, paused many ministries, and sun-downed others. Out of that year we emerged with a new sense of our vision to Love. Grow. Serve. (everything we do as a church must include each of these three) and our values of genuine hospitality, inter-generational relationships, service in our communities, becoming a church of small groups, and a focus on making disciples who make disciples.

This has helped us focus around our core ministries of our church, particularly inter-generational Sunday worship, grow groups, and Wednesday evening programming for all ages. We have committed to better embody Love.Grow.Serve. in Community Care, Christmas Camp, inter-generational mission trips, and in launching life groups. We are also discerning for new ministry ideas that Jesus may be showing us.

As we look back, we see some long-term and key ministries have completed their life cycles. These include ASP, VBS, the Bluegrass Festival, Summer BBQs, YPA and the Dulac Mission Trip. We give God thanks for these ministries and take pride in the lives we have been able to touch for God. We commit with renewed passion to serve faithfully in our current signature ministries. Also, we are excited to see new energy and new passion for emerging ministries as we go forward into our vision.

This summer brought some upgrades to our facilities as well. We have updated our fellowship hall / event center, re-roofed our flat roofs, and improved the fire pit. Other minor projects continue, such as painting the education rooms and upgrading our internet service.

As we look forward, we have discerned that Jesus has given us a particular focus as a church on helping people grow spiritually. Although we strive to reach new people, what we do well is calling and equipping people of faith to mature and deepen their discipleship. Put succinctly, our goal is to help whomever God sends among us to take that next step closer to Jesus. Our specialty is helping people to live out their faith in their daily lives and to pursue holiness.

This is where we believe that Jesus is leading us as church. He is born at Christmas to be our Savior. Celebrating Christmas includes us choosing to follow where He leads us into the new year ahead. That year will be a year of growing spiritually, growing in Christian maturity, growing in holiness.

A year from now, we hope we will not be the same. We will be different, because Jesus will have led us through this next year, and He will continue to lead us still. He has committed to lead us all the way to heaven! As the Christmas Carol Once in Royal David's City ends, "He leads His children on to the place where He has gone."

Lay Leader Report 2019

God's goal is for us to become mature adults—to be fully grown, measured by the standard of the fullness of Christ....By speaking the truth with love, we are to grow up in every way into Christ." -Ephesians 4:13-15

As your Lay Leader for Forest Hills Church, I oversee the Action Ministry Team (AMT). It is our job to set the vision for our church and guide others to move that vision forward. God gave us a new vision and it is this: Forest Hills church is Christ centered, with a focus on making disciples who love God and others, grow in Christ, and serve our wider communities.

Motto: Love.Grow.Serve

Guiding principles for all ministries:

- 1. People are finding a personal relationship with Christ (LOVE)
- 2. People are growing in faith (GROW)
- 3. Christ's love is more visible in our community (SERVE)

At the beginning of the year, Pastor David asked us to reflect on discipleship. How is our personal journey with Christ? Are we listening to others and helping them to learn more about Christ? How can we pass His love on to others in our community?

Each month in The Edge, I try to highlight what's going on with updates and new developments. Be sure to tune in and read all the articles each month. In the first quarter of the year, our leaders at Forest Hills were invited to attend 4 video workshops about Discipleship Pathways. From this we created a task force to pitch ideas about our own Pathway. People come to us in all walks of life and we need to meet them where they are and help them grow to maturity. Discipleship is what being a Christian looks like. First disciples follow, then disciples grow, and finally disciples make more disciples. The work of the church is not just to win people for Jesus, but to make disciple-making disciples. This radically changes what we do as Christians. This means time, relationships, mentoring. This means worship, fellowship, grow groups and life groups. Life groups are small 4 to 6 people groups for accountability. These people we share our daily struggles with, pray with and encourage. We have several Life Groups now and want the whole congregation to step up and create their own. We hope to have guidelines for Life Groups coming first quarter of 2020. The Action Ministry Team has also been working on a self-assessment tool that will help each of us determine where we are on our journey as a disciple. Each person would answer questions on a private survey and get an email back with ideas crafted especially for them. This is also coming first quarter of 2020.

One of our goals for 2019 was to create a "New Idea Proposal Form" and a "Ministry Evaluation Form". We want all ministries to meet the guiding principles I mentioned before. To help facilitate that, the idea was brought forth to have a ministry fair in January. It is called Vision 20/20 and will be held on Sunday January 19 the following worship. AMT will provide refreshments and table set-up. Each ministry team is invited to participate. Create your own table display to show what your ministry is, show pictures of past events, and invite new people to join in the team. All teams will be getting information about this asap. Please let Amanda Lucas or myself know that you want to participate.

During our AMT meetings we talk a lot about God and how to become better Christians. But we don't want to just talk about it, we want to do it. We are excited to hear people's new ideas for passionate ministries, as well as helping our current ministries get refreshed and renewed. Won't you join us? If you are God is good, all the time!

Summer 2020 Mission Trip

Join us this summer for our Inter-generational mission trip! This past summer, 12 of us headed out to the last frontier to be the hands and feet of God in the broader community. In 2020, we are serving those in our own state. We are again partnering with Praying Pelican, a Minnesota based missions group, to serve the poor and marginalized in Minneapolis and the surrounding urban communities. Our primary partner will be Good in the Hood. Their desire is to inspire individuals, families and entire neighborhoods to take responsibility and ownership for the growth, improvement and well-being of their personal lives and community. Through partnerships and kindness-based initiatives they believe the physical, emotional and spiritual climate of an entire community can be changed for good.
