"Then God spoke all these words: I am the Lord your God who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery." -Exodus 20:1-2

When we were at the Vatican last summer, we saw their collection of

Roman sculptures. Included was this head of the god Janus, the god of beginnings and transitions. Janus is depicted as having two faces: one facing forward, but also one facing backward. Our current calendar of months is based on the Roman calendar, and the month carries the namesake of this god. We have begun a new year, and as we look forward to the year ahead, it is also good to look back on the previous year. Looking backward helps us look forward.

As we begin the new year, it is a good as Christians to look forward to (meaning both looking ahead as well as being excited about what's coming) where God is leading us. This requires trust and confidence, an inner assurance that God will take us through whatever is ahead.

Yet where does this trust come from? It comes from looking back! We remember all that God has done to get us to this point, all the ways that God has proven that He is trustworthy. We have "God with Us," helping us in the past, and promising to continue to help us into the future. Spend some time as you being this new year remembering what God has done in your life - all that He has done to prove to you that He is trustworthy and reliable. This will give you boldness going forward.

We are still in the 12 Days of Christmas. We remember that God sent Jesus to be our Savior. He showed up in person rescued us from our slavery to sin and our sentence of death. Because of Christmas, we have Jesus with us, guiding us into the path of life in the year ahead. He set us free so we could live free!

Our January message series is on the 10 Commandments. The 10 Commandments are the bedrock of how God's people are to live. All the other rules for godly living are built on them.

Pastor's Perspective Cont'd

It is key to remember that God provided His people with the 10 Commandments right at the crucial junction: after He had liberated them from slavery in Egypt and before leading them into the Promised Land. He wanted to set His people up for success! God wanted His people to have the best life possible, to live abundantly in the future. So, as God tells them the best rules to live by, He begins by reminding them that He freed them from slavery in Egypt: "I am the Lord your God who brought you out of Egypt, out of the house of slavery." He calls them to look back and see what He has done for them. He reminds them how He showed His love for them in such a dramatic way and how they know they can trust Him. The rules to live by, they see, are a gift from Him to free them for living abundantly. They were set free so they could live free!

We're looking back to The 10 Commandments so that we can live our best possible lives going forward. They aren't just a list of rules, things we should do even though we don't want to. They are not obsolete or even dated. We continue to have the same longings, the same foibles, and the same tendencies. They are a radical call to live very differently. God gave them a long time ago, but these core principles still illumine the way to the best life. They reflect God's character, and they resonate God's image in us.

This will be a 2-part message series. The first (January-February), Love God, will cover the first four commandments. They focus our love singularly on God. The second series (after Easter), Love Others, will cover the remaining six commandments and guide us to live out our love for God in how we love our neighbors. Have you noticed how the 10 Commandments are an expansion of the greatest commandments: loving God and loving others? The 10 Commandments are the Greatest Commandments, expanded! They are the path to abundant life!

As we begin our new year, remember God's love. Remember His faithfulness. Remember how He wants the best possible life for you. Remember He is trustworthy! When we look back to look forward, we see that God has set us free so that we can live free!

This past week 9 of our teens volunteered with Christmas camp. This helped provide winter VBS style daycare for over 40 kids in our community.

In January we are starting our next series called Lenses. The whole goal of this series is to examine five common

worldviews that many teenagers tend to hold (their "lenses"), gently expose them as unfulfilling narratives for their lives, and help students begin to swap out the lies for gospel truth (God's lens). Each week, we will be digging into an account from Jesus' life to see how Jesus addressed these common worldviews with a new lens. Here's the breakdown for the next six weeks:

Week 1: Real life and light come when you change your lens. (John 1)

Week 2: Good is never good enough because only God is good. (Luke 18:18-27)

Week 3: The pursuit of happiness puts you on a treadmill. The pursuit of Jesus puts you on the path to eternal happiness. (John 4)

Week 4: The selfie-centered life leads to isolation. Selflessness leads to true connection. (Luke 13:1-17, 34-35) Week 5: My faith should be personal but not private. (Matthew 28:16-20)

Week 6: Doing life God's way is life to the fullest. (Matthew 7:13-14, 21-23, John 10:10, Jeremiah 17:9)

UMCOR Kits

We will be collecting items for the UMCOR bags this year. UMCOR comes alongside those who suffer from natural or human-caused disasters - be it famine, hurricane, war, flood, fire or other events—to alleviate suffering and to be a source of help and hope for those left most vulnerable. We provide relief, response and long-term recovery grants when these events overwhelm a community's ability to recover on their own. UMCOR also provides technical support and training for partners to address emerging and ongoing issues related to disaster relief, recovery, and long-term health and development.

Here are items needed for the bags:

School Kit Materials

- One pair blunt scissors
- Round tips only
- No plastic scissors
- One box of 24 crayons
- Only 24-count boxes are accepted
- Three one-subject notebooks
- No marble composition books
- No 3 or 5-subject notebooks
- One pack of loose-leaf paper
- 100-200 page packets are acceptable
- Wide or college rule accepted
- One hand-held pencil sharpener
- 1-inch or longer
- Remove from packaging
- One ruler
- 12 inches or 30 centimeters long
- Sturdy or flexible material accepted
- Six unsharpened pencils
- One eraser
- Two inches or larger
- One two-gallon re-sealable plastic bag

All items are due Feb 3rd. Once collected Kay and Bergie will be heading down to UMCOR later that month to deliver packages.
