We are struggling to love others well. Our current reality is polarized into factions, the pandemics of racism and COVID-19 divulge deep-seated divides and anxieties, public language grows ever more decisive, name-calling and hate speech is common, the political campaign year continues to slide into mudslinging, violence is erupting.

The Christian calling is to love one another. The Church leads the way to a different way! God's people stand as an alternative in our current situation. We call out another way. We name a different path. We point to a hope that changes everything.

It starts with each one of us. Paul puts Jesus in front of us and calls us to adopt lives modeled after His. He says in Philippians 2:1-5, "Therefore, if there is any encouragement in Christ, any comfort in love, any sharing in the Spirit, any sympathy, complete my joy by thinking the same way, having the same love, being united, and agreeing with each other. Don't do anything for selfish purposes, but with humility think of others as better than yourselves. Instead of each person watching out for their own good, watch out for what is better for others. ## **Wednesday Night Programing**

Summer has reached its end (kinda). The school year is about to begin (kinda). Things are getting back to normal (not really). We have hybrid learning going on for our students. We have the cultural embrace of masks being worn everywhere. We have an underlying anxiety about an unknown virus. But as Christians, we know that God is good all the time. We must not be deterred in our ability or willingness to worship and serve him. We've been thrown the curveball, but we still need to approach that base and take a swing. Will we strikeout or will it be a grand slam? In all honesty, that is not for us to decide. The question we need to answer right now is: are we being faithful? Are we using our gifts and talents to make disciples?

To that very end, Forest Hills Church is returning to our Wednesday night schedule (kinda). This month, starting September 9th we will host Echo in the large room upstairs, youth group in the large room downstairs, confirmation in the office area and Echo Jr. in the nursery.

Wednesday nights are for everyone! We are all called, old and young, to be disciples! We want Wednesday nights to be intergenerational! In Matthew 28 Jesus commands his disciples to "go and make disciples...baptizing them...[and] teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you." We cover the baptism part on Sunday mornings and Wednesdays are for taking on the teaching part. Disciples make disciples...we teach and guide others into the truth of God's word. Who are you teaching?

To help you answer that question, Echo has been revamped for this year. We will have a team of adults take on different roles throughout the evening to teach, to encourage, to build generational bridges.

Throughout the year adult grow groups will rotate into Echo, serve as disciple-makers for that cycle and then resume a normal grow group come next cycle. We also have incorporated a time of mentoring in which adults and kids will be paired together for a chance to connect across generational lines and experience what it is to make disciples!

Please be aware that, while we are returning to Wednesday night programming, due to Covid precautions, it will not look the same. We will not be serving community meals and eating together. When we meet, everyone will be asked to wear masks and remain physically distanced. Finally, a slight time change from last year. We will begin the evening at 6:30 and conclude at 7:45.

So here we are standing at the plate. Circumstances have thrown us the curveball. Are we going to throw in the towel and give up? No! We keep calm and carry God. We stand strong, take a swing, remain faithful and trust God with the results.
