

From the Pastor's Perspective Do Good Feel Good Christmas

"The people walking in darkness have seen a great Light. On those living in a patch-dark land, Light has dawned." -Isaiah 9:2

With the shortening of daylight, the creeping in of the cold, the spread of COVID-19, and the isolation of keeping distance, it is easy to turn into a Scrooge for Christmas. We can't gather with family and friends as we might like, and our worship during this special time of year is going to be remote. It makes us want to say grumpily, "Bah-humbug!"

Well, actually, I DO want to call us to be a Scrooge this Christmas! Now, it's not quite what you may think. I'm talking about being like Scrooge AFTER the events told in Charles Dickens' A Christmas Carol. Scrooge did start out crabby, negative, selfish and bitter. But a probing look at himself (into the boardroom of his soul) and the effects of his negativity revealed that he was stuck in his sin and was facing imminent death and doom. Opening his soul to Christmas, however, brought him a transforming second chance.

Christmas is about transforming second chances! Jesus came born as a baby in Bethlehem to bring conversion of our souls and transformation to our lives. After Christmas, Scrooge became a man filled with joy and blessing. That's what Christmas does for us, too! We need to celebrate Christmas like a Scrooge—like Ebenezer Scrooge after his Christmas experience.

Scrooge went from feeling bitter to feeling good. Scrooge went from only doing selfish things to lavishly doing good. And this is what Jesus does for us! No matter how frustrated we may feel, Christmas is still real! Christmas is still about transformation! Jesus still brings in joy, hope, faith, and love no matter what our spirits feel about the season this year!

Kids Christmas

We find ourselves once again in the midst of shutdowns and increased COVID-19 precautions. It looks as though this Christmas season has become something none of us would have imagined a year ago. As has been demonstrated nation-wide, distance learning has largely been a failure. Kids, especially in elementary and below, need face-to-face interaction, a personal touch and the camaraderie of classmates in order to thrive. The support of parents at home can help, but many looming challenges remain. In short, a screen cannot replace a human presence.

Yet here we are proposing that Christian education from church be done at home on a screen. It is a blessing to have the technology to produce videos, but often too much of a good thing can be a bad thing. So, let me encourage you and provide a few tips to help your kids engage learnings about their faith and not simply zone out in front of another screen.

1. Make faith formation a priority.

There is no flowery way to put it. So often in the life of a kid, church is a rung or two below school, sports, and "other" activities. Additional barriers and precautions only serve to justify our laxity. As followers or Christ, we must make a strong stand and commit to staying the course. Read scripture with your kids, pray as a family, and take advantages of the resources we will be offering.

2. Complete the activities.

In the coming weeks we will continue to utilize our Trackers of Truth curriculum. Each week we will be presenting a bible story with a short and easy project or activity to complete as a family. Not everything we in every lesson will interest everybody, but I want to encourage you to make the most of it. We are asking everyone to put something together and then share it with us here at church by emailing us a picture or short video of what you have done. We can then include these submissions with the next week's lesson! This will allow us to see and share with one another even though we are not actually meeting.

3. Enjoy Jesus.

This world will pass away, but Jesus remains. He is our hope, the light of the world and our source of joy even in the worst of circumstances. As Paul writes in Romans 8, "I'm convinced that nothing can separate us from God's love in Christ Jesus our Lord: not death or life, not angels or rulers, not present things or future things, not powers or height, or depth, or any other thing that is created (including a pandemic)." If we as adults can enjoy Jesus, we provide the best lesson our kids could ever learn.
