"Jesus said many things to them in parables...." -Matthew 13:3a

We've been learning this fall that Jesus is our King of kings and Lord of Lords. He is our Savior who died on the cross to earn our forgiveness and rose again to win our abundant and eternal life. But it seems that the most common title used for Jesus by those who listened to Him while here on earth (His disciples as well as others) was "good teacher" or "rabbi."

Jesus, when going back to His hometown of Nazareth at the beginning of His earthly ministry, picks up the Isaiah scroll and reads, "The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because He has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor" (Isaiah 61:1-2 quoted by Jesus in Luke 4:18-19). He then explains that this is why He has come.

So proclaiming is a key part of His purpose on earth. He went from village to village, healing, preaching and teaching the people that the Kingdom of Heaven was at hand (Matthew 4:23). People followed Him as their rabbi, and even acquaintances called Him "Good Teacher" (Luke 18:18). He taught the people many times, such as the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7), the Sermon on the Plain (Luke 6), by the lake (Luke 5:1-3), in villages (Luke 13:22), even in other countries (Mark 7:24, 31). It was so typical to find Jesus teaching that Luke casually sets a scene in 5:17, "One day when Jesus was teaching...."

One of the distinctive styles that Jesus used in teaching was parables. Parables are spiritual lessons applied from common, everyday life. Jesus used parables from ordinary things that were just there, all around, such as farming, fishing, shepherding, eating, baking, clothing, family relations, money, lamps, and so forth. You can almost imagine following Jesus along the road, listening to Him teaching. Then, as you walk past a farmer planting seeds, and Jesus turns and says, "A farmer went out to sow his seed...."

Jesus was a master of parables. And when He taught them, the listener was supposed to identify with some character or some application of the story. So, when hearing a parable of Jesus, we ask, "Who am I in that story?" then "What am I to do?" Parables are powerful because they do not just teach information, they also urge behavior as we live. Parables are lessons from ordinary life for ordinary life!

In Sunday worship during November I'm going to try Jesus' example and offer some parables of my own. The messages will be taken from Scripture, but the stories will come from our everyday lives. For example, on Oct. 31 is the Parable of the Pumpkin. Then November will be the parables of the candle, the \$20 bill and the turkey.

My hope is that by drawing on these common images from our lives, I will be able to pass along the biblical applications that we've learned from Jesus. Again, our goal will be to listen for where we find ourselves in each parable and hear what this may mean for us. And again, this is not just about learning information. It's about being guided into action, into behaviors.

So, as we head into November, let's walk with Jesus. As we walk, we look around our daily lives and notice what we see. God's world is filled with His lessons! We listen for God's voice, using everyday objects to teach us how to live our everyday lives.

Let's become good students of The Great Teacher!

I love this church! I love this church because we don't take the easy road. I love this church because we refuse to sit comfortably at home. I love this church because we take seriously the calling of Christ. This last Sunday, on Halloween evening, families from all over our community stopped by our Trunk or Treat event. Nearly 300 adults and kids enjoyed a safe and fun experience. We had 24 trunks, served up pulled pork sandwiches and were able to spread a little light in our corner of Forest Lake. Each parent received a small bag of information about our church and a pocket-sized version of John's Gospel. Kids received plenty of candy, but they were also able to come away with the understanding that our church is thinking about them and cares about what interests them.

Trunk or Treat does not lend itself to on-the-spot conversions or the sharing of powerful testimonies. It's a bridge building event. It is an outlet by which we as the church can begin to create inroads with those who live around us. At times it may feel transactional: they come, they eat, they leave; yet, over time, these roads begin to lead to somewhere important. We have been doing Trunk or Treat for six years now...we are a bit of a staple for many families. We have had repeat visitors from new neighborhoods. We have been able to make small connections that would not have been possible otherwise. We even had a dad ask if their family could host their own trunk next year since they live in a rural area that does not get trick or treaters.

It's a small bridge for sure, but I believe a small bridge, a slight crack in the door, a mustard seed, is all God needs to work!

Thank you for being a faithful church! Thank you for stepping up and stepping out into the chilly night to meet families where they are!
