The Son of Man

“The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me. He has sent me to preach good news to the poor, to proclaim release to the prisoners and recovery of sight to the blind, to liberate the oppressed, and to proclaim the year of the Lord’s favor.” -Luke 4:18-19 & Isaiah 61:1-2

Happy New Year! At church we’ve already started our new resolution: to read through the Gospel of Luke on Sundays together this year.

We started a bit early, in December, with Luke’s Christmas story in Luke 1-2. So now in January and February we read Luke 3-6 in a message series called “Son of Man.” Here we join in following Jesus as He, at the age of 30, begins His public ministry of preaching, teaching and performing miracles. As we walk with Jesus along with Luke, we often hear Jesus refer to Himself by the strange title, “The Son of Man.” For example, in Luke 6:5, “Jesus said to them, “The Son of Man is Lord of the Sabbath.”” Jesus is talking about Himself!

We saw Jesus born as a human baby, but He was born as the son of woman (Mary). Joseph was not Jesus’ biological father. The Holy Spirit came upon Mary and she became pregnant with God, the Heavenly Father, being Jesus’ divine Father. So, Jesus was son of woman and Son of God. So why, then, did Jesus commonly refer to Himself by the strange title, “The Son of Man?”

Jesus uses this awkward phrase in the public scene because it has roots back in the Old Testament. It had been used sometimes to mean a human being. But importantly, especially in Ezekiel and Daniel, the phrase was also used to refer to the coming messiah. The Jews knew, therefore, that the Messiah would be God, as Isaiah 9:6 says, but also human, as the title, “The Son of Man” described. During the time between the Old and New Testaments, the phrase came to mean “King Messiah” who would judge among the nations. So, when we hear Jesus referring to Himself as the Son of Man, He’s using this loaded title to make the link back to the Old Testament prophesy of the coming Messiah, who would be King and Judge.

As we follow Jesus, we join with the crowds who try to sort this out. They remember that this is Joseph’s son (3:23 and 4:22), but we also hear God’s voice from heaven at Jesus’ baptism say, “This is my son!” (3:22). Luke traces Jesus’ human ancestry back to Adam, showing He is indeed a member of the human race (a generic son of man!). But then immediately the devil proclaims “you are God’s Son” (4:9), followed by the demons confirming this when Jesus casts them out (4:41).

The title “Son of Man” helps us remember that Jesus, as fully God, has the power, healing and authority of God, but also that as fully human, has the mission and purpose to rescue the human race from the power of sin, sickness and death and the authority of evil. That’s why early on Jesus explains in His hometown (Capernaum) synagogue that He has come to fulfill the prophesy from Isaiah 61:1-2 (quoted above). Yet this was not just for His hometown, but for all people. So Jesus also “said to them, ‘I must preach the good news of God’s kingdom in other cities too, for this is why I was sent’” (4:43).

So, we now “see” Jesus as He leaves home: transitioning from His earthly father’s business to His Heavenly Father’s business! It’s now, at this point, that we get to really start following Jesus, for He begins calling disciples. We move from passively watching the story of His birth to actively following Jesus.

This becomes our real New Year’s resolution: not just reading through Luke’s Gospel, actively following Jesus as we read Luke’s Gospel! He is God’s Son, and we proclaim Him our God. Yet He is also The Son of Man, and so we proclaim Him as our Savior. We follow Him as His disciple, and as we do, we find we are changed.
