

From Staff Parish Relations Pastoral Change Announcement

To Forest Hills Church congregation:

Bishop David Bard intends to appoint The Reverend David Werner to Evangel United Methodist Church in Rochester Minnesota. The new appointment will begin August 1, 2022.

Our District Superintendent, Cynthia Williams, will use information from our church's profile, and past consultations, and conversations with our Staff Parish Relations (SPR) Chairperson and committee members to assist the Bishop and Cabinet in making a new pastoral appointment. Cynthia's first meeting with our CMMT/ SPR team is scheduled for the first week of May 2022 to discern the pastoral needs of our church.

The process is following the Itinerant System. "The itinerant system is the accepted method of The United Methodist Church by which ordained elders, provisional elders, and associate members are appointed by the bishop to fields of labor. All ordained elders, provisional elders, and associate members shall accept and abide by these appointments." (From The Book of Discipline of the United Methodist Church 2016)

We thank Pastor David, and the Werner family for the past 13 years of care and service to Forest Hill United Methodist Church.

Slow Release Sermon

I have heard it said that worship songs are a "slow-release sermon". Often during the week, I find myself humming a melody that we sang in church and it isn't long before the words follow and before I know it, my mind and my mouth are singing God's truth. It's the same truth I heard preached on Sunday, but the music helps me reaffirm it all later down the road.

I believe it is very important to carefully consider the words we sing in our services. Like the lyrics on the radio, the message a song sends sticks with us. For this coming month, we are introducing a new song entitled, "Let Your Kingdom Come". It is nothing more than a prayer set to music that cries out for the glory of God to reign in this world and in our lives. The song does not leave us without a sense of responsibility, as verse two puts it:

"Lord use us as You want, whatever the test By grace, we'll preach Your gospel Till our dying breath"

Then the chorus resounds with a same request that Jesus instructed his disciples to make:

"Let Your kingdom come, Let Your will be done!"

Music is always a creative undertaking. Musicians and artists are putting together something new and yet the best worship songs do not deviate from the primacy of God's word. They retain the ancient ideas that have carried the Church and will continue to carry the Church into the future until His kingdom comes!

Our Love Offering this year will address food insecurity by supporting three Minnesota United Methodist food ministries. Funds will also assist those in need in our nation and world by supporting Red Bird Missionary Conference in Appalachia and Volunteers in Mission trips.

The funds from this year's offering will to go to:

- The Red Bird Missionary Conference in Appalachia (40 percent)
 - Food insecurity across Minnesota (50 percent, divided among the three ministries)
 - Holy Grounds at Centenary UMC, Mankato (17 percent)
 - Simpson Food Pantry, Minneapolis (17 percent)
 - West African Family and Community Food Shelf, Brooklyn Center (17 percent)
 - Volunteers in Mission scholarships (10 percent)
