

From the Pastor

In this month of February, we begin our celebration of Lent. Lent is a time we set aside so that we can prepare ourselves for the wonder of Easter morning. Jesus rose from the grave, defeating sin and ushering us into eternal life! What a glorious victory we are able to share!

But the glorious result comes at a price. In order to truly understand that victory, in order to truly feel the impact of Easter, we must first journey to the cross. In Lent, we walk with Jesus through his experience of rejection, suffering and death. Lent then, is a solemn season. It is filled with purpose and intent. We may know how the story ends, but we also know it is a story worth revisiting.

This year for Lent, we are going to employ a well-known and powerful modern hymn to help guide us through this season. How Deep the Father's Love for Us has been a staple in the song lists of many churches. The lyrics lay out the gospel and the melody makes it memorable. We will simply use this song as a launching point from which we can dive into the story of our salvation. There is always more to be discovered as God continues to reveal the depths of his mercy and love for us. The song was published in 1995 and written by the prolific Stuart Townend who hails from the UK. His father and brother both serve as pastors, and he has dedicated himself to inspiring and equipping the Church through music. Many of his songs serve to articulate our faith in words, and How Deep the Father's Love For Us is no exception. Following are the lyrics to this hymn which will guide us through our time of Lent:

In his letter to the Corinthians, Paul bluntly said that if the resurrection of Christ hadn't happened, our faith would be pointless. Other religious traditions have some references to people coming back from the dead, but nothing like the story of Jesus.

Typically, other religions depict people coming back from the dead to become gods, yet the way these so-called gods ruled was generally selfish and unloving, or the resurrections led eventually to them eventually dying again With Jesus, something very different happened and it's the cornerstone of our Christian faith.

In Resurrection, we will explore the power of resurrection and discuss how it should impact their lives, not just in the afterlife, but in the here and now.

Specifically, we will look at the following:
